

Current law also allows a court to suspend the operating privilege of an underage person who operates a vehicle while there is an intoxicant in the vehicle for up to 30 days

This bill eliminates the permissive statute and retains the statute that requires the court to suspend the operating privilege for varying periods, depending on the number of prior offenses.
