a) Requested Change

Amend s. 101.14 (4) (c) (1), Stats. to change the reference to the name of the organization from the Building Officials and Code Administrators International, Inc. (BOCA) to the International Code Council, Inc.

b) Problem

The statutory provisions are out of date. The organization referenced has not existed since October of 2002 when the three model code organizations, of which BOCA was one, became the International Code Council, Inc.

c) Need for Change

The deletion of a statutory reference to the obsolete BOCA will update and increase the clarity of the statutory language administered by the Department.

d) Fiscal Effect

No fiscal impact is expected from this change, because current revenues or expenditures would not be affected.

e) Other

This proposal does not involve any significant policy change. There should be no objection to making this change. However, the Wisconsin State Fire Chiefs Association and their counterparts may use an editorial change such as this to

further state their preference to affiliate with the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA)., an alternative model code.
