

2007 SENATE BILL 234

July 18, 2007 – Introduced by Senators LEIBHAM and ROESSLER, cosponsored by Representatives ZIEGELBAUER, KESTELL, LEMAHIEU, JESKEWITZ, TOWNSEND, TURNER and M. WILLIAMS. Referred to Committee on Transportation, Tourism and Insurance.

1 **AN ACT** *to create* 84.1023 of the statutes; **relating to:** designating and marking
2 STH 57 as the 57th Field Artillery Brigade Memorial Highway.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, certain highway routes and bridges have been designated and marked to memorialize, commemorate, or recognize certain individuals, groups, or events. This bill directs the Department of Transportation to designate and, upon receipt of sufficient contributions from interested parties, mark the entire route of STH 57 as the “57th Field Artillery Brigade Memorial Highway” to honor the members of the 57th Field Artillery Brigade of the Wisconsin national guard, also known as the “Iron Brigade,” who have bravely served their country with pride, distinction, sacrifice, devotion, and honor since World War I, including deployment to Afghanistan. No state funds, other than from contributions from interested parties, may be used for the erection or maintenance of any markers on STH 57 to identify the highway as the “57th Field Artillery Brigade Memorial Highway.”

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

3 **SECTION 1.** 84.1023 of the statutes is created to read:
