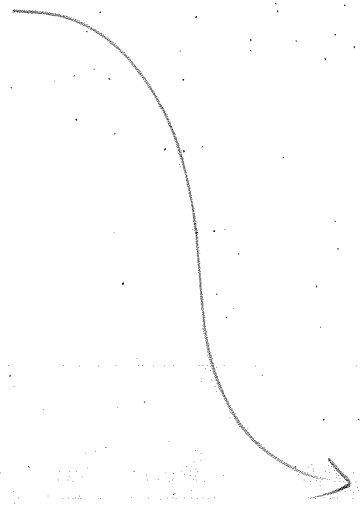

Hi Peter,

I just have a couple of notes for you on the virtual schools amendment, after talking to a few folks. Thanks, as always, for your work on this.

1. The report from LAB would be due by December 30, 2009.
2. If we could be more specific about what the audit should include, that would be preferred. In that case, it should include, but not be limited to:
 - a. Comparing current state per-pupil reimbursement rate for open enrollment in virtual charter schools to the actual educational costs for virtual charter school pupils
 - b. Determining the actual and potential impacts of payments to virtual charter schools for open enrolled pupils on the budgets of the school districts of residence of those pupils and other school districts in the state
 - c. Comparing the academic achievement of pupils in virtual charter schools to pupils of similar socioeconomic backgrounds in regular public schools
 - d. Determining the average number of student-teacher contact hours in virtual charter schools by grade level
 - e. Determining the percentages of virtual charter school students by grade level who, in the year prior to enrolling in the virtual charter school: did not attend, attended a public school, attending a private school, or attended a home-based education program
3. Determining the impact of the freeze on enrollment on the ability of Wisconsin pupils to access virtual charter schools
