WISCONSIN AGRICULTURAL EDUCATION AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL

√ 1. <u>Creation</u>

There is created an agricultural education and workforce development council, attached to the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection. The primary purpose of this council shall be to develop innovative initiatives and enhancements to existing efforts that develop the human capital required to grow Wisconsin agriculture, food, natural resources and related industries. . [As created in 4589/P1 under 15.137 (2) (a) – Members listed below in #3.]

2. Functions

The agricultural education and work force development council shall serve as a means to:

- 1. Promote the alignment of educational systems and curriculum to develop, train, and re-train the agricultural, food and natural resource systems ("AFNR") workforce for current and future careers;
- Increase the effective acquisition and retention of the best possible AFNR workforce;
- ee 3. Develop support for employment in the AFNR relative fields; and
 - Suggest policy development and other infrastructure improvements to increase the efficiency of agricultural education development and delivery.

The council shall seek to accomplish these purposes by advising and assisting state agencies and educational institutions on matters related to agricultural education and workforce development, including all of the following:

- 1. The coordination of programs
- 2. The exchange of information related to educational needs
- √3. The identification, monitoring, and measurement of success factors
- 4. Reporting annually according to sub. (5), including recommended changes to and sunset of the council, if appropriate.

3. Members

The agricultural education and workforce development council shall consist of members from private industry, state agencies and the educational institutions in Wisconsin that provide agricultural education and workforce development. Private business shall represent a majority of the voting members on the council. The private industry members shall be recommended by the council to and appointed

by the Secretary of Agriculture, Trade, and Consumer Protection. The agricultural education council shall consist of the following members:

- 1. The Secretary of Agriculture, Trade, and Consumer Protection or his or her designee.
- 2. The State Superintendent of Public Instruction or his or her designee.
- √3. The Secretary of Workforce Development or his or her designee.
- 4. The Secretary of Commerce or his or her designee.
- 5. The Secretary of Natural Resources or his or her designee.
- 6. The President of the University of Wisconsin System or his or her designee.
- 7. The Director of the Technical College System or his or her designee.
- 8. The Chancellor of UW-Extension.
- √9. A representative chosen by the UW Consortium of Education and Research
 in Agriculture and Natural Resources ("CERANR") representing the UWMadison College of Agriculture & Life Sciences, UW Platteville and UW River Falls Colleges of Agriculture and the UW-Madison College of Veterinary
 Medicine; and the UW-Stevens Point College of Natural Resources.
- 10. A representative of the Wisconsin Association of Agricultural Educators.
- 1. Two representatives of general agriculture.
- √12. Two representatives of agribusiness.
- √3.A representative of environmental stewardship interests.
- 44. A representative of businesses related to natural resources.
- √15. A representative of businesses related to plant agriculture.
- 16. A representative of the green industry. Green industry to include landscaping, golf courses, green houses, floral companies and related industries.
- $\sqrt{17}$. A representative of food products and food processing businesses.
- 18. A representative of businesses related to animal agriculture.
- 19. A representative of businesses related to energy and/or renewable energy.
- 20. A representative of agricultural communications interests.
- √21. A representative of businesses providing engineering, mechanical, electronic, and power services relating to agriculture.
- 22. A representative of the DATCP Board.
- √23. The Chairs of the assembly and senate agricultural and education committees.

4. √ <u>Designees</u>

A person who is authorized under par. (a) 1. to 7. to appoint a designee may only appoint a designee who is an employee or appointive officer of the person's department or educational institution and who has sufficient authority to deploy department or system resources and directly influence department, agency, or institutional decision making.

5. √ <u>Terms</u>

The secretary of agriculture, trade and consumer protection shall appoint members of the council under par. (a) 10 to 21 to serve staggered three-year terms. A member of the council under par. (a) to 21 may not serve more than 2 consecutive three-year terms on the council. [Fine as drafted in 4589/P1 – under Nonstatutory provisions]

$\sqrt{6}$. Officers

At the first meeting in each year the council shall elect a chairperson, vice chairperson, and secretary from among its members. Any officer may be elected for successive terms. [Per 15.09 (2) – no need to add in the draft]

7. Staff

The Council will be staffed by an Executive Director. The DATCP, DPI, WTCS, DWD, DNR and the CERANR may provide staff that will serve in an ex-officio capacity and will support the functions of the council.

Authorize one new FTE - to be housed at DATCP – funded by a combination of program revenue continuing appropriation and general purpose revenue as outlined in the "Funding" section of this document.

8. Meetings

The council shall meet at least once each year and may meet at other times on the call of at least six members – Section 15.09 (3) does not apply to meetings of the council. The Executive Committee may call meetings of the full council.

The Executive Committee shall meet between meetings of the entire council to provide direction for council and provide oversight and guidance to the staff that will carryout the functions of the council.

9. Quorum

A majority of the membership of the council constitutes a quorum to do business, and a majority of a quorum may act in any manner within the jurisdiction of the council. [Per 15.09 (4) – no need to add in the draft]

10. <u>Committees</u>

The council will create an Executive Committee to guide the council and provide guidance to staff members. The council may also create other committees to assist in its work. The committee members may include members of the council, employees of the agencies and educational institutions with members on the council, employees of other state agencies, representatives of various organizations, and the general public. The council shall consider the need for committees on the subjects within the scope of its general duties and functions under Subparagraph (2) and other subjects deemed appropriate by the council. Each committee shall provide a written summary of their meetings and activities to

the Council Executive Committee for review and to be included in the annual report.

11. Funding

Funding to be used for staffing and any activities of the council authorized by this legislation shall be provided in the following fashion:

- 1. Fiscal years 2007-08 and 2008-09: Privately-raised funds (program revenue continuing appropriations) matched by GPR funds with GPR funds capped at \$75,000 in each fiscal year.
 - 2. Fiscal years 2009-10 and 2010-11: Privately-raised funds matched by GPR funds with GPR funds capped at \$150,000 in each fiscal year.
 - Fiscal year 2011-12 and beyond: Privately-raised funds matched by GPR funds capped at \$200,000 in each fiscal year.
- 4. Project-specific activities that require funding will be funded separately.

√12. Reimbursement of Expenses

Members of the council shall not be compensated for participation as members on the council. [Fine as drafted in 4589/P1 – amended 15.09 (6)]

13. Annual Report

In September of each year, the council shall submit to the head of each agency and educational institution with membership on the council, the governor, and the chief clerk of each house of the legislature, for distribution to appropriate standing committees under Section 13.172 (3), a report which summarizes the operations and activities of the council during the fiscal year concluded on the preceding June 30. The annual report shall include an assessment of agricultural education programs, a list and description of current and anticipated agricultural education problems, information on the implementation of this council, and set forth the recommendations of the council including dissolution of the council, if appropriate. In each annual report, the council shall also include the dissents of any council members relative to the activities and recommendations of the council.







The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- **SECTION 1.** 15.09 (6) of the statutes is amended to read:
- 15.09 (6) REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES. Members of a council shall not be compensated for their services, but, except as otherwise provided in this subsection, members of councils created by statute shall be reimbursed for their actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties, such reimbursement in the case of an elective or appointive officer or employee of this state who represents

an agency as a member of a council to be paid by the agency which pays his or her
salary. Members of the loan originator council under s. 15.187 (1) may not be
reimbursed for their actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of
their duties. Members of the agricultural education and workforce development
council may not be reimbursed for their actual and necessary expenses incurred in
the performance of their duties.

Section 2. 15.137 (2) of the statutes is created to read:

- 15.137 (2) AGRICULTURAL EDUCATION AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL. (a) There is created in the department of agriculture, trade and consumer protection an agricultural education and workforce development council consisting of the following members:
- 1. The secretary of agriculture, trade and consumer protection or his or her designee.
 - 2. The state superintendent of public instruction or his or her designee.

In September of each year, the council shall submit a report to the appropriate standing committees of the legislature as determined by the speaker of the assembly and the president of the senate, under s. 13.172 (3), the governor, the secretary of agriculture, trade and consumer protection, the state superintendent of public instruction, the secretary of workforce development, the secretary of natural resources, the secretary of commerce, the president of the University of Wisconsin System, the director of the technical college system, the chancellor of the University of Wisconsin-Extension, the chancellor of the University of Wisconsin-Platteville, the chancellor of the University of Wisconsin-River Falls, and the chancellor of the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point. (6) FUNDING. In any fiscal year, the department may not encumber from the appropriation under s. 20.115 (8) (b) an amount that exceeds the amount of private contributions received for the purposes of the council in that fiscal year.

Notwithstanding the length of terms specified in section 15.137 (2) (c) of the statutes, as created by this act, the secretary of agriculture, trade and consumer protection shall appoint 5 of the initial members of the agricultural education and workforce development council under section 15.137 (2) (a) 11. to 23. of the statutes, as created by this act, for terms ending on July 1, 2009, 5 of the initial members of the agricultural education and workforce development council under section 15.137 (2) (a) 11. to 23. of the statutes, as created by this act, for terms ending on July 1, 2010, and 5 of the initial members of the agricultural education and workforce development council under section 15.137 (2) (a) 11. to 23. of the statutes, as created by this act, for terms ending on July 1, 2011.
 - (2) Position authorization.
- (a) The authorized FTE positions for the department of agriculture, trade and consumer protection are increased by 0.5 GPR position to be funded from the appropriation under section 20.115 (8) (b) of the statutes, as created by this act, for an executive director for the agricultural education and workforce development council.
- (b) The authorized FTE positions for the department of agriculture, trade and consumer protection are increased by 0.5 PR position to be funded from the appropriation under section 20.115 (8) (ge) of the statutes, as created by this act, for an executive director for the agricultural education and workforce development council.

This bill creates an Agricultural Education and Workforce Development Council. The council consists of legislators, members from several state agencies and educational institutions, and members representing businesses related to agriculture, natural resources, and related areas such as food processing. The members representing businesses are appointed by the Secretary of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection. The bill requires the council to advise state agencies on matters related to agricultural education and workforce development in order to increase the hiring and retention of well-qualified employees in industries related to agriculture, food, and natural resources. The bill appropriates state funds for the council, but the council may not expend state funding in any fiscal year in an amount greater than the amount of private contributions that it receives in that fiscal year.
