<b>Description</b> Vehicle registration plates for certain sex offenders and providing penalties					

### Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Assembly Bill 226 directs the Department of Corrections to provide to the Department of Justice information sufficient to identify a person required to have chartreuse-colored plates on a motor vehicle registered in their name. The Department of Justice shall then make the information available to local law enforcement through the Transaction Information for Management of Enforcement (TIME) System.

The TIME System is a computer-based data communications control center managed by DOJ. The control center computers interface TIME System terminals to data files and provide the capability to send administrative messages between terminals. The mission of the TIME System is to facilitate the rapid and efficient exchange of factual information between law enforcement agencies.

Currently, when a law enforcement officer runs a "name search" through the TIME System, that officer has access to DOC sex offender records. Under AB 226, DOJ anticipates that DOC would add to those sex offender records information relating to the chartreuse license plate requirement. As a result, DOJ may have to make minor database and system delivery modifications at a cost of approximately \$10,000.
