## Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill prohibits the Milwaukee Public Schools (MPS) from imposing residency requirements on teachers.

State fiscal effect: None.

Local fiscal effect:

The fiscal effect of this bill on local government is indeterminate. There are many factors that may be influenced by the bill but the department does not have the information necessary to determine a fiscal effect. For example:

- It is not known whether this bill will increase or decrease the number of qualified teachers available to fill MPS positions.
- This bill may increase the distribution of advertisements that MPS finds necessary to recruit qualified staff. Instead of advertising only within a locality, MPS may feel it needs to advertise more widely.
- This bill could affect labor relations in the next contract period because the bill makes residency requirements a prohibited subject of bargaining.
