## Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under current law, a person selling alcohol beverages at retail must possess a license or permit authorizing the sale.

A "Class B" license, issued for specific premises, authorizes the sale of intoxicating liquor at retail for consumption on the premises where sold. Current law imposes a quota, based on a formula partially determined by population, on the number of "Class B" licenses that a municipality may issue. Current law also provides a limited number of quota exceptions.

The bill permits any village in the northern geographical half of Ozaukee County, having a population of more than 4,000, to issue one "Class B" license in addition to the "Class B" licenses otherwise authorized under the village's quota. Currently, only the Village of Saukville would be enabled to issue an additional "Class B" license under the bill. Issuing the license would create a minor increase in local license revenues and possibly increase local government costs.

The department anticipates no additional administrative expenses under the bill.
