State of Wisconsin Legislative Audit Bureau

The Honorable, the Legislature:

As requested by the Public Service Commission (PSC), we have completed a financial audit of the Universal Service Fund, which was established to ensure that all state residents receive essential telecommunications services and have access to advanced telecommunications capabilities. It is funded primarily through assessments on telecommunications providers, which totaled \$30.2 million in fiscal year (FY) 2005–06. Our audit report contains our unqualified opinion on the Universal Service Fund's financial statements for the fiscal years ending June 30, 2006 and 2005.

The largest program supported by the Universal Service Fund is the Educational Telecommunications Access Program, which is administered by the Department of Administration. This program subsidizes data lines and video links for eligible educational institutions. In FY 2005–06, expenditures for these activities totaled \$11.6 million, or 50.4 percent of the Universal Service Fund's total expenditures. In September 2006, the State completed the conversion to a new statewide data and video network for program participants, as well as for state government and other public sector users.

Eight of the 13 programs supported by the Universal Service Fund are operated by the PSC. The Legislature limits the amount the PSC can annually assess telecommunications providers for the PSC-operated programs to \$6.0 million. The limit and growth in expenditures from FY 2001–02 through FY

2004–05 have presented budgetary challenges for these programs. In response, the PSC has reduced benefits and limited expenditures to better match its spending authority.

During FY 2005–06, revenues exceeded expenditures by \$8.8 million for several of the programs funded through the Universal Service Fund, which increased the fund balance to \$15.8 million as of June 30, 2006. Most significantly, funding received for the Educational Telecommunications Access Program exceeded expenditures by \$6.6 million. We include a recommendation that the PSC work more closely with the Department of Administration and the University of Wisconsin System in establishing annual assessment levels.

We appreciate the courtesy and cooperation extended to us by staff at the PSC; the departments of Administration and Public Instruction; the University of Wisconsin System; and the Universal Service Fund's administrator, Wipfli LLP.

The Honorable, the Legislature:

This report is transmitted as required by s. 20.002(11)(f), Wisconsin Statutes, (for distribution to the appropriate standing committees under s. 13.172(3), Wisconsin Statutes) and confirms that the Department of Administration has found it necessary to exercise the "temporary reallocation of balances" authority provided by this section in order to meet payment responsibilities and cover resulting negative cash balances during the month of July 2007.

On July 2, 2007, the <u>Medical Assistance Trust Fund</u> cash balance closed at a negative \$27.2 million, its intramonth low. This negative balance continued through July 23, 2007, when the fund's cash balance closed at a positive \$211 thousand. The negative balance was due to the difference in the timing of revenues and expenditures.

On July 3, 2007, the <u>Dry Cleaner Environmental</u> <u>Response Fund</u> cash balance closed at a negative \$57 thousand. This negative balance continued intermittently through July 31, 2007, when the fund's cash balance closed at a negative \$30 thousand. The <u>Dry Cleaner Environmental</u> <u>Response Fund</u> cash balance reached its intramonth low of a negative \$91 thousand on July 19, 2007. The negative balance was due to the difference in the timing of revenues and expenditures.

On July 2, 2007, the <u>Wisconsin Health Education Loan</u> <u>Repayment Fund</u> cash balance closed at a negative \$2 thousand. This negative balance continued through July 31, 2007, when the fund's cash balance closed at a negative \$2

thousand. The negative balance was due to the difference in the timing of revenues and expenditures.

The Medical Assistance Trust Fund, Dry Cleaner Environmental Response Fund, and Wisconsin Health Education Loan Repayment Fund shortfalls were not in excess of the statutory interfund borrowing limitations and did not exceed the balances of the funds available for interfund borrowing.

The distribution of interest earnings to investment pool participants is based on the average daily balance in the pool and each fund's share. Therefore, the monthly calculation by the State Controller's Office will automatically reflect the use of these temporary reallocations of balance authority, and as a result, the funds requiring the use of the authority will effectively bear the interest cost.
