

WISCONSIN LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL ACT MEMO

2007 Wisconsin Act 72 [2007 Senate Bill 335]

Publication of Local Ordinances

Under prior law, a city, village, town, county, or town sanitary district generally was required to publish the complete text of an ordinance in a local newspaper.

Wisconsin Act 72, as an alternative to publication of a complete notice, authorizes a local unit of government to publish a notice of an ordinance that contains at least all of the following information:

- 1. The number and title of the ordinance.
- 2. The date of enactment.
- 3. A summary of the subject matter and main points of the ordinance.
- 4. Information as to where the full text of the ordinance may be obtained, including the telephone number of the county clerk, a street address where the full text of the ordinance may be viewed, and a website, if any, at which the ordinance may be accessed.

Effective Date: The Act takes effect on March 26, 2008.
