

WISCONSIN LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AMENDMENT MEMO

2007 Assembly Bill 206	Assembly Amendment 1

Current law prohibits a person who has not reached the legal drinking age, and who is not accompanied by his or her parent, guardian, or spouse who has attained the legal drinking age, from entering or being on any premises for which a license or permit for the retail sale of alcohol beverages has been issued. Current law also provides for various exceptions to this prohibition.

Assembly Bill 206 creates an exception to this prohibition for the premises of the Wisconsin Renaissance Faire in Chippewa Falls. Assembly Bill 206 expressly prescribes the effective date of the bill as the first day of the third month beginning after publication.

<u>Assembly Amendment 1</u>

Assembly Amendment 1 removes the delayed effective date of the bill. Under s. 991.11, Stats., an act which does not expressly prescribe the time when it takes effect shall take effect on the day after its date of publication.

Legislative History

The Committee on Small Business introduced Assembly Amendment 1 to 2007 Assembly Bill 206. The committee recommended adoption of Assembly Amendment 1 by a vote of Ayes, 9; Noes, 0; and recommended passage of Assembly Bill 206, as amended, by a vote of Ayes, 9; Noes, 0; on April 10, 2007.
