

WISCONSIN LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AMENDMENT MEMO

Under Assembly Bill 69, the requirements for registration as a professional engineer would be increased. Specifically, under Assembly Bill 69, an applicant for registration as a professional engineer would be required to submit satisfactory evidence of graduation from an approved engineering course of not less than *four* years and a record of four or more years of experience indicating the applicant is competent to be placed in charge of engineering work.

<u>Senate Amendment 1</u>

Senate Amendment 1 provides that as an alternative to the engineering course of four years, an applicant may utilize a diploma of graduation or degree from a technical college in an engineering-related course of study of not less than *two* years.

The amendment provides that an applicant possessing a diploma or certificate from a course of study of not less than four years as specified in the bill, must also have a specific record of *four* or more years of experience in engineering work of a character satisfactory to the Examining Board and indicating the applicant is competent to be placed in charge of engineering work.

Senate Amendment 1 also specifies that for an applicant possessing a diploma or degree from a course of study of not less than two years as specified in the amendment, must have a specific record of *six* or more years of experience in engineering work of a character satisfactory to the Examining Board and indicating the applicant is competent to be placed in responsible charge of engineering work must be provided.

<u>Legislative History</u>

Assembly Bill 69 was passed by the Assembly on a voice vote on January 15, 2008. The bill was referred to the Senate Committee on Labor, Elections, and Urban Affairs. Senate Amendment 1 to 2007 Assembly Bill 69 was offered on February 19, 2008 by Senator Plale.

The Senate Committee adopted Senate Amendment 1 on a vote of Ayes, 4; Noes, 0, and recommended passage of the bill on a vote of Ayes, 4; Noes, 0.
