
Dear Senator Plale:



Thank you for the opportunity to speak in support of the appointment of Eric Callisto, to Chair of the Public Service Commission, to serve for the interim term ending March 1, 2009 and a full term ending March 1, 2015.

The Sierra Club, on behalf of its 15,000 Wisconsin members, is working to reduce greenhouse gases by at least 2 per cent per year by promoting clean energy sources and eliminating major sources of CO<sub>2</sub> and other air pollution, such as coal-fired power plants.
