I would like to express my appreciation of this opportunity to serve on the WI Board of Examiners Social Work Section. Having completed my first term in July of 2006, I am convinced that my experience as a Chair and Section member along with a better understanding of my role will greatly enhance my effectiveness during this second term. It is my intention to continue to give back to the profession of Social Work that has contributed so much to my personal and professional growth.

During my first term, I was able to contribute to the transition from Social Work Certification to a standard of title and practice protection by establishing the Licensure level of competence. My work on an Ad Hoc committee also focused on the Alcohol and Drug treatment capabilities of the Licensed Mental Health provider. Collaboration with the WI Certification Board produced the mutually acceptable language seen under MPSW 1.09. The establishing of a minimum of 400 hours of internship for the Social Work Training Certificate was particularly significant.
