## Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under current law, the Department regulates food service establishments such as restaurants, and the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) regulates retail food establishments, including grocery stores. AB 10 requires DHS and DATCP to prepare a plan to consolidate their food programs into one safety program for the Legislature.

DHS and DATCP are also required to appoint a committee of individuals with an interest in food safety to provide information and advice in preparation of the plan. The bill requires the Departments to include a description of the efficiencies and savings that would result from consolidation.

Currently DHS does not have staff to absorb this new workload. It is estimated that it would require 1.0 FTE Project Program and Planning Analyst (PPA), for one year, to produce this report, at a cost of \$65,800. The PPA would evaluate the special distribution of facilities around the state, the types of facilities and qualifications necessary to inspect each, and the distribution of administrative and management oversight responsibilities for the central and regional offices. The PPA would then identify alternative models for combining some or all programs with DATCP and project cost differences for the alternatives. Finally, the PPA would prepare a report for the legislature and present the findings to agency managers and the legislature. Additional costs related to the committee are estimated to be \$3,000. The total cost of this bill will be \$68,800.
