Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill prohibits the knowing sale, to a purchaser in this state, of consumer goods or certain farm products that contain a radio frequency identification tag. unless the person renders the radio frequency identification tag inoperable before the purchaser takes possession of the goods or products.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 100.5 of the statutes is created to read:

100.55 Consumer goods; radio frequency identification tags. (1) In this

section:
