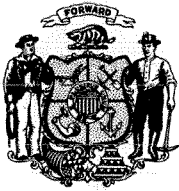

AN ACT ^{gen.} relating to: the date of pupil counts in second semester of school year.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, each school district is required to file an annual report with the Department of Public Instruction. The report must include the average of the number of pupils enrolled in the district on the ^(DPI) 3rd Friday of September and the ^{third} 2nd Friday of January in the previous school year.

This bill changes the date of the pupil count in January to the last Friday of that month. The bill makes changes elsewhere in the statutes where the pupil count conducted on those dates is used as an indicator of enrollment in a school district. ^{second}

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:
