



**ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT 1,
TO ASSEMBLY SUBSTITUTE AMENDMENT 1,
TO 2009 ASSEMBLY BILL 271**

October 27, 2009 – Offered by Representative CLARK.

1 At the locations indicated, amend the substitute amendment as follows:

2 **1.** Page 35, line 15: after that line insert:

3 **“SECTION 102g.** 443.14 (17) of the statutes is created to read:

4 443.14 **(17)** An employee of a provider of broadcast service, as defined in s.
5 196.01 (1m), provider of cable service, as defined in s. 196.01 (1p), public utility, as
6 defined in s. 196.01 (5), or telecommunications provider, as defined in s. 196.01 (8p),
7 who is engaged in establishing and depicting on a map the location of an easement
8 necessary for the provision of services by the provider of broadcast service, provider
9 of cable services, public utility, or telecommunications provider if the map includes
10 all of the following:

11 (a) A legal description of each tract of land affected by the easement. In this
12 paragraph, legal description has the meaning given in s. 706.01 (7r), except that,

1 notwithstanding s. 66.0217 (1) (c), internal references to any other document may be
2 used to establish and depict on the map the location of the easement.

3 (b) The width of the easement.

4 (c) The identification of each point at which the easement intersects each
5 boundary of each tract of land affected by the easement.

6 **SECTION 102r.** 443.14 (18) of the statutes is created to read:

7 443.14 (18) An employee of a cooperative association organized under ch. 185
8 for the purpose of producing or furnishing heat, light, power, or water to its members
9 only, who is engaged in establishing and depicting on a map the location of an
10 easement necessary for the provision of services by the cooperative association if the
11 map includes all of the following:

12 (a) A legal description of each tract of land affected by the easement. In this
13 paragraph, legal description has the meaning given in s. 706.01 (7r), except that,
14 notwithstanding s. 66.0217 (1) (c), internal references to any other document may be
15 used to establish and depict on the map the location of the easement.

16 (b) The width of the easement.

17 (c) The identification of each point at which the easement intersects each
18 boundary of each tract of land affected by the easement.”.
