Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Though data are unavailable, most prosecutors anticipate that enactment of this bill would dramatically increase the number of cases they would handle. These cases currently are civil, but enactment of the bill would make them criminal.

Estimating conservatively, prosecutors anticipate a need of approximately 53.75 ADAs to handle cases associated with enactment of this bill. The additional cost would be:

Annual salary = \$47,036 Annual fringe = \$18,433 TOTAL = \$65,469 x 53.75 ADAs = \$3,518,959.
