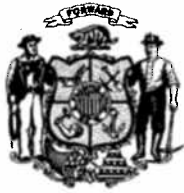

In line with our discussion regarding SB 251, we are suggesting a change that would place this new provision under Subchapter I, Costs in Civil Action and Special Proceedings. It could be placed at the end of the subchapter, numbered 814.52 or other number as appropriate. We think it is more appropriate to call it a "cost" rather than a "fee" throughout the draft. We leave it to you to decide: (1) whether this can be a simple amendment or a substitute amendment, and (2) whether language should be included in the amendment to indicate it applies in both civil and criminal proceedings (similar to the language contained in s. 814.51) or whether this is implied.

I have talked to Sarah Barry of Sen. Jauch's staff and copied her in so that she can indicate whether she wants you to proceed with the amendment. Here's our suggesting wording, with words to be deleted placed in brackets.

SECTION 1. 814.52 of the statutes is created to read:
814.52 Costs of Transporting by Ferry. (1) If a law enforcement agency requests a ferry provider to operate beyond its usual hours of operation in order to transport an

1 AN ACT to create 814.625 of the statutes; relating to: costs of transporting by
2 ferry an arrested person.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a person who is subject to a fine or forfeiture for violating a state law or local ordinance is also subject to a variety of court costs, fees, and surcharges.

Under this bill, if when a person is arrested, he or she is transported by ferry after the ferry's usual hours of operation, the person ~~is~~ subject to a fee that reimburses the law enforcement agency that incurred the costs of transporting the person by ferry.

For further information see the *state and local* fiscal estimate, which will be printed as an appendix to this bill.
