Hi Chris.

Marlin wanted the bill to require companies to accept payments due if the mail is postmarked within 48 hours of the due date before or after. Marlin wants the bill to mandate that companies accept payments postmarked on, say, the 3rd of the month, 48 hours after due date, rather than suffer a penalty if it is not received by the first.

We've had a couple constituent complaints about persons submitting their mail thought to be on time, but winding up that mail was delayed and payment was received on the 2nd, resulting in a penalty for the consumer.

After some poking around, it's not clear whether a 2-day adjustment of a bill due date under an existing contract would run afoul of the Contracts Clause. You have a couple of options:

1. A bill that would apply only to contracts formed after the effective date of the bill. This would not pose the constitutional

issue we talked about, because the Contracts Clause applies only to modifications of contract that are already in existence.

2. A bill that would apply to contracts currently in existence and to contracts formed after the effective date of the bill. This could be ruled unconstitutional as applied to contracts currently in existence if a court were to decide that there isn't a sufficiently serious public purpose for the bill, or that there isn't a tight enough 'fit' between the problem the bill is intended to fix and the requirements of the bill.

Let me know what you'd like to do.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill prohibits a person from compiling commercial mobile service telephone numbers (cellular telephone numbers) for the purpose of including the telephone numbers in a directory that is offered for sale or lease to another.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 134.725 of the statutes is created to read:

- 134.725 COMPILATION OF COMMERCIAL MOBILE SERVICE NUMBERS. (1) In this section, "commercial mobile service" has the meaning given in s. 196.01 (2i).
- (2) No person may compile the commercial mobile service telephone numbers of individuals for the purpose of including the telephone numbers in a directory that is offered for sale or lease to another.

As the bill is drafted, I think this would run afoul of the prohibition. As a practical matter, it seems unlikely that a DA would bring an enforcement action against someone for that kind of violation, but the best fix is probably to modify the prohibition to read:

No person may compile the commercial mobile service telephone numbers of individuals for the purpose of including the telephone numbers in a directory of commercial mobile service telephone numbers that is offered for sale or lease to another.

That way, if someone accidentally catches a cell number in the process of trying to compile a directory of land lines, they would not be compiling for the purpose prohibited by the bill. Let me know if you'd like a redraft or amendment.
