AN ACT *to create* 86.257 of the statutes; **relating to:** transferring ownership and jurisdiction of a municipality's highways to an American Indian tribe or agency of the United States government.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under this bill, a city, village, or town (municipality) may transfer jurisdiction and ownership of a highway that is owned by the municipality and is under the jurisdiction of the municipality to a federally recognized American Indian tribe or band in this state or an agency of the United States government by entering into a jurisdictional transfer agreement with the tribe or agency.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. 86.257 of the statutes is created to read:

86.257 Transfer of municipality's highways. A municipality, as defined in s. 82.01 (6), may transfer jurisdiction and ownership of a highway that is owned by the municipality and is under the jurisdiction of the municipality to a federally recognized American Indian tribe or band in this state or an agency of the United
