

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill makes a number of changes to the regulation of dietitians.

Licensure and use of titles

Under current law, a person may be certified as a dietitian by the Dietitians Affiliated Credentialing Board (board) in the Department of Regulation and Licensing (DRL). With certain exceptions, current law prohibits a person who is not certified by the board from designating himself or herself as a dietitian, claiming to provide dietetic services, or using any title or initial that would represent that person as certified or licensed as a dietitian or in a nutrition–related field.

This bill directs the board to license, not certify, persons as "dietitians or nutritionists." With certain exceptions, the bill prohibits a person who is not licensed from practicing dietetics or nutrition care services. The bill also prohibits, with certain exceptions, a person who is not licensed by the board from using certain titles or initials.

"Dietitian" is defined under current law as an individual who practices dietetics, which means, generally, using certain nutrition principles to achieve or maintain the health and assess the nutritional needs of and provide nutritional counseling to an individual or group of individuals.

This bill changes the title of a person licensed by the board from "dietitian" to "dietitian or nutritionist," and changes the title of the board to the Dietetics and Nutrition Care Services Affiliated Credentialing Board. In the bill, a dietitian or nutritionist is a person who practices dietetics and nutrition care services. The bill defines "dietetics and nutrition care services," generally, as the integration and application of certain scientific principles to achieve and maintain optimal human health. In the bill, the practice of dietetics and nutrition care services includes assessing nutritional needs and dietetic and nutrition therapy and excludes the retail sale of food products or vitamins.

Requirements for licensure by the board

Under current law, to be certified as a dietitian or nutritionist, a person must: 1) receive a bachelor's, master's, or doctoral degree in certain nutrition fields from a college or university that the board determines is accredited or receive a degree from a program in nutrition approved by the board; 2) complete at least 900 supervised hours of dietetics practice; and 3) pass the registration examination, or its equivalent, established by the American Dietetic Association (ADA). A person who has satisfied these educational and practice requirements and who has applied to take the next available examination, may obtain a temporary dietitian certificate.

Under the bill, to be licensed by the board, a person must: 1) possess a bachelor's, master's, or doctoral degree granted from a regionally accredited college or university and complete a didactic program in dietetics approved by the ADA; 2) complete 900 supervised practice hours under a supervised practice program

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accredited by the ADA; and 3) pass the registration examination for dietitians established by the ADA. A person who satisfies these educational and practice requirements and who submits a letter from the ADA verifying their registration eligibility status, may obtain a temporary license.

The bill requires an applicant for renewal of a license to provide DRL with proof of registration with the ADA or satisfactory completion of continuing education requirements established by the board by rule.

Exemptions from licensure

Current law exempts a person who is licensed or certified and lawfully practicing in certain fields from obtaining certification from the board provided the person practices within the scope of his or her license or certificate and does not claim to be a dietitian or licensed in a nutrition–related field. In addition, current law exempts the following from obtaining certification from the board: 1) persons who are pursuing a degree or certificate from an educational program approved by the board; 2) a dietetic technician or assistant working under the supervision of a certified dietitian; 3) a dietitian serving in the U.S. armed forces; and 4) a person who markets or distributes food and other goods, who explains the use, benefits, or preparation of food and other goods, and who furnishes nutritional information about food and other goods provided that person does not claim to be a dietitian or certified dietitian and that person complies with applicable law.

Under the bill, the following persons do not need to obtain a license from the board: 1) a licensed or certified nurse, chiropractor, dentist, physician, physical therapist, podiatrist, athletic trainer, occupational therapist, optometrist, pharmacist, or acupuncturist lawfully practicing within the scope of that license or certificate; 2) a dietitian or nutritionist serving in the U.S. armed forces; 3) a retailer that furnishes oral or written general nutrition information about food and other goods; 4) a person who is not practicing dietetics and nutrition care services who provides general nutrition information about food and other goods; and 5) a person who provides weight control services under a program of instruction approved in writing by a licensed dietitian, a physician, or a person registered as a dietitian with the ADA.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This substitute amendment makes a number of changes to the regulation of dietitians.

Licensure and use of titles

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Under current law, a person may be certified as a dietitian by the Dietitians Affiliated Credentialing Board (board) in the Department of Regulation and Licensing (DRL). With certain exceptions, current law prohibits a person who is not certified by the board from designating himself or herself as a dietitian, claiming to provide dietetic services, or using any title or initial that would represent that person as <u>certified</u> or licensed as a dietitian or in a nutrition-related field.

This substitute amendment directs the board to license, not certify, persons as x "dietitian nutritionists." With certain exceptions, the substitute amendment prohibits a person who is not licensed from practicing dietetics or nutrition care services. The substitute amendment also prohibits, with certain exceptions, a person who is not licensed by the board from using certain titles or initials.

"Dietitian" is defined under current law as an individual who practices dietetics, which means, generally, using certain nutrition principles to achieve or maintain the health and assess the nutritional needs of and provide nutritional counseling to an individual or group of individuals.

This substitute amendment changes the title of the board to the Dietetics and xNutrition Care Services Affiliated Credentialing Board. This substitute amendment changes the title of a person licensed by the board from "dietitian" to "dietitian nutritionist." In the substitute amendment, a dietitian nutritionist is a person who x practices dietetics and nutrition care services. The substitute amendment defines "dietetics and nutrition care services," generally, as the integration and application of certain scientific principles to achieve and maintain optimal human health. In the substitute amendment, the practice of dietetics and nutrition care services includes assessing nutritional needs and dietetic and nutrition therapy and excludes the retail sale of food products or vitamins.

Requirements for licensure by the board

Under current law, to be certified as a dietitian, a person must: 1) receive a bachelor's, master's, or doctoral degree in certain nutrition fields from a college or university that the board determines is accredited or receive a degree from a program in nutrition approved by the board; 2) complete at least 900 supervised hours of dietetics practice; and 3) pass the registration examination, or its equivalent, established by the American Dietetic Association (ADA). A person who has satisfied these educational and practice requirements and who has applied to take the next available examination, may obtain a temporary dietitian certificate.

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Under the <u>substitute amendment</u>, to be licensed as a dietitian nutritionist by the board, a person must: 1) possess a bachelor's, master's, or doctoral degree granted from a regionally accredited college or university and complete a didactic program in dietetics approved by the ADA; 2) complete 900 supervised practice hours under a supervised practice program accredited by the ADA; and 3) pass the registration examination for dietitians established by the ADA. A person who satisfies these educational and practice requirements and who submits a letter from the ADA verifying their registration eligibility status, may obtain a temporary license.

The <u>substitute</u> amendment requires an applicant for renewal of a license to provide DRL with proof of registration with the ADA or satisfactory completion of continuing education requirements established by the board by rule.

Exemptions from licensure

Current law exempts a person who is licensed or certified and lawfully practicing in certain fields from obtaining certification from the board provided the person practices within the scope of his or her license or certificate and does not claim to be a dietitian or licensed in a nutrition-related field. In addition, current law exempts the following from obtaining certification from the board: 1) persons who are pursuing a degree or certificate from an educational program approved by the board; 2) a dietetic technician or assistant working under the supervision of a certified dietitian; 3) a dietitian serving in the U.S. armed forces; and 4) a person who markets or distributes food and other goods, who explains the use, benefits, or preparation of food and other goods, and who furnishes nutritional information about food and other goods provided that person does not claim to be a dietitian or certified dietitian and that person complies with applicable law.

Under the <u>substitute amendment</u>, the following persons do not need to obtain a license from the board: 1) a licensed or certified nurse, chiropractor, dentist, physician, physical therapist, podiatrist, athletic trainer, occupational therapist, optometrist, pharmacist, or acupuncturist lawfully practicing within the scope of that license or certificate; 2) a dietitian nutritionist serving in the U.S. armed forces; 3) a retailer that furnishes oral or written general nutrition information about food and other goods; 4) a person who is not practicing dietetics and nutrition care services who provides general nutrition information about food and other goods, provided the person discloses to the person's client that the person is not licensed as a dietitian nutritionist; and 5) a person who provides weight control services under a program of instruction approved in writing by a licensed dietitian nutritionist, a physician, or a person registered as a dietitian with the ADA.

FISCAL ESTIMATE PROCESS

OVERVIEW.

The LRB drafting attorney makes the initial determination that a bill requires a fiscal estimate. Upon introduction, the LRB transmits electronically all drafts requiring a fiscal estimate to the Fiscal Estimate Coordinator at DOA for assignment. If desired, the draft's requester can request to have the fiscal estimate assignments made prior to the draft's introduction. All agencies that would collect money, receive an appropriation, administer a program, or have the most knowledge about the bill are required to prepare a fiscal estimate. Upon completion, an authorized agency representative reviews and approves the fiscal estimate.

Then the agency electronically forwards the fiscal estimate to DOA for its review. Under Joint Rule 46 (5), DOA may correct a computational or other clerical error without making any substantive change. (On its own initiative, however, DOA may submit a supplemental fiscal estimate when it disagrees with the original fiscal estimate the affected state agency submitted.) DOA then forwards the fiscal estimate to the LRB, which electronically forwards the fiscal estimate to the bill's primary author for review. After introduction, the fiscal estimate is reproduced separately as an appendix to the bill.

ELECTRONIC TRANSMISSION OF FISCAL ESTIMATES.

Legislative Joint Rules require that all fiscal estimate requests and all documents submitted in the fiscal estimate process be transmitted electronically rather than in paper form. A presiding officer may, however, permit a primary author to transmit a request for a *supplemental* fiscal estimate by other means, and the president of the Senate and the speaker of the Assembly acting jointly may permit, for a limited time, the transmission in paper form.

FISCAL ESTIMATE DETERMINATIONS.

Prior to the bill's introduction, the bill's requester may challenge the drafting attorney's decision by contacting the LRB chief. The chief's decision at this stage is final.

If someone discovers after introduction that the LRB failed to detect the bill's possible fiscal implications, a request for a fiscal estimate may be submitted to DOA if both the bill's primary author and the LRB chief agree. In this case, legislative action on the bill does not stop for the fiscal estimate to be prepared. Also, per Legislative Joint Rule 49, any legislator may raise a point of order that a fiscal estimate is required when the bill is before the legislator's house. In that case, the presiding officer's decision that the bill needs a fiscal estimate is final subject to overruling by the house. If it is decided that the bill requires a fiscal estimate, the statutes provide that legislative action stops until the fiscal estimate is obtained.

Occasionally a bill is marked "fiscal estimate required" when it does not have a fiscal effect. However, it is better that a few bills come back from agency experts with a fiscal estimate reading "This bill has no fiscal effect because it neither increases nor decreases any state or local fiscal liability or revenue" than to fail to send out for a fiscal estimate a bill that may have a significant hidden fiscal effect.



Hi Fred -

Did Rep. Pasch decide whether she wants to have the fiscal estimate forwarded on AB 440? If she does, we'll need you to send the jacket back, our bureau chief will hand-write on the jacket that a Fiscal Estimate accompanies the bill, and both will come back to you. If not, we will simply "kill" the fiscal estimate.

A quick refresher -- LRB 09-1946/1 did have a fiscal estimate. However, because I used a substitute amendment from Sen. Vinehout's office as the underlying draft in the substantially modified LRB 09-1946/2, and because substitute amendments never have fiscal estimates, the /2 version (now introduced as AB 440) did not have the fiscal estimate tag. This was an oversight on my part. Because the bill has been introduced, we cannot amend the bill to add the fiscal estimate tag. Because there is no fiscal estimate tag, our offices cannot forward the revised version of the fiscal estimate associated with the new bill.



Let me know what Rep. Pasch has decided. I did not ever hear back from Sen. Vinehout's office, but SB 115 *does* have a fiscal estimate tag, so the fiscal estimate is not being held up in the senate.
