Every person who has served in the U.S. armed forces at any time, and who has been honorably discharged or given a certificate of service or relieved from active service may record with the register of deeds of any county, in a suitable book provided by the county for that purpose, a certificate of service or release, or such other document deemed necessary and appropriate by the county veterans service officer. The eertificate documents shall be accessible only to the discharged person or that person's dependents if deceased or duly authorized representative, as defined in s.45.04 (1) (a), the county veterans service officer, the department, or any person with written authorization from the discharged person or that person's dependents if deceased. The register of deeds may not charge for recording, except that in counties where the register of deeds is under the fee system and not paid a fixed salary, the county shall pay the fee specified in s. 59.43(2) (ag). The record of any certificate of discharge or release made prior to July 6, 1919, is legalized.

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AN ACT ...; relating to: veterans records with the register of deeds.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Currently, a veteran who has been been honorably discharged or given a certificate of service or relieved from active service may record the certificate of discharge or release with the county register of deeds. Under current law, the recorded certificate is accessible only to the veteran, the veteran's dependents, a duly authorized representative of the veteran, the county veterans service officer, the department of veterans affairs, or a person with written authorization from the veteran or the veteran's dependents. Currently, "duly authorized representative" includes a person with written authorization from the veteran, or if no representative is authorized in writing, the veteran's spouse, adult child, or the parents of an unmarried veteran.

This bill expands what can be recorded in the register of deeds office to include documents that the county veteran service officer considers necessary and appropriate for recording. The bill also limits a dependent's access to the veteran's records to only allow that access if the veteran is deceased.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- **SECTION 1.** 45.05 of the statutes is amended to read:
- 3 45.05 Registration of certificate of discharge. Every person who has
 - served in the U.S. armed forces at any time, and who has been honorably discharged

or given a certificate of service or relieved from active service may record with the register of deeds of any county, in a suitable book provided by the county for that purpose, a certificate of discharge or release, or documents that the county veterans service officer considers necessary and appropriate for recording. The certificate documents recorded under this section shall be accessible only to the discharged person or that person's dependents or duly authorized representative, as defined in s. 45.04 (1) (a), the county veterans service officer, the department, the person's the discharged person is deceased, or any person with written authorization from the discharged person or that discharged person's dependents if the discharged person is deceased. The register of deeds may not charge for recording, except that in counties where the register of deeds is under the fee system and not paid a fixed salary, the county shall pay the fee specified in s. 59.43 (2) (ag). The record of any certificate of discharge or release made prior to July 6, 1919, is legalized.
