Proposal: Amend s.62.63 to Allow Unclaimed Funds in the City of Milwaukee Employes' Retirement System (ERS) to be Retained

#### **Background**

Under current law, Wisconsin Statutes Chapter 177, the Uniform Unclaimed Property Act, applies to the City of Milwaukee pension fund (one of three public pension funds in the state). Annually, the ERS must send unclaimed pension benefits to the State of Wisconsin. The City of Milwaukee ERS is seeking an exception to Ch. 177 as is currently provided to the Wisconsin Retirement System.

#### Goal

 To retain abandoned funds in the Employes' Retirement System to assist in the overall funding of the retirement system

#### **Key Points**

The unclaimed funds would be reinvested in the pension fund and become part of the funding reserve to help offset actuarial and market losses which periodically occur.

The ERS should be treated similarly to the Wisconsin Retirement System. The WRS is allowed to reinvest abandoned funds. The Uniform Unclaimed Property Act does not apply to WRS due to a statutory exception (s.40.08).

An exemption would allow the City's fund to retain and safeguard the abandoned property of City employees rather than paying it to the state. The ERS would remain obligated to pay the benefit when or if it was ever claimed.

The City of Milwaukee is obligated to use taxpayer funds to fully fund the ERS for 2010. Retaining any abandoned funds helps to minimize any taxpayer obligation.

Because this bill relates to public employee retirement or pensions, it may be referred to the Joint Survey Committee on Retirement Systems for a report to be printed as an appendix to the bill.

## The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

**Section 1.** 62.63 (5) of the statutes is created to read:

62.63 (5) TREATMENT OF ABANDONED RETIREMENT ACCOUNTS. Funds in employee retirement accounts of a retirement system of a 1st class city, which are presumed abandoned under s. 177.13, are not subject to the custody of the state as unclaimed property under ch. 177, but shall be retained by the retirement system and used to reduce employer funding obligations to the retirement system. The board of a retirement system of a 1st class city shall devise rules and regulations for determining the conditions under which employee retirement accounts are presumed abandoned and for determining the manner in which funds in the abandoned employe retirement accounts may be used to reduce employer funding obligations to the retirement system.

## Representative Fields:

Per your request, I permitted the City of Milwaukee Employes' Retirement System to retain abandoned employee retirement accounts and to use funds in these accounts for reducing employer funding obligations to the retirement system. I note that you are working on this issue at the request of the City of Milwaukee and thus you may wish to have city staff review the draft to make sure it is drafted as intended.

Please be aware that there are many different ways to address this issue, with differing levels of statutory detail. I simply required the retirement system board to devise rules and regulations for determining the conditions under which employee retirement accounts are presumed abandoned and for determining the manner in which funds in the abandoned employee retirement accounts may be used to reduce employer funding obligations to the retirement system.

Once you are satisfied with this preliminary draft, I will immediately prepare it for introduction.
