Chris,

I spoke with Jennifer Kammerud at the DPI about the notification draft.

During our conversation we discussed Assembly Bill 316, a Legislative Council Study Committee bill that, among other things, modifies statutes relating to computation of school days, to account for days on which school is closed by order of the Department of Health Services (DHS), and days on which school is closed by order of a school district administrator because of a threat to health or safety.

Specifically, AB 316 creates a new statutory section 115.01 (10) (a) 3., which reads, "Days on which school is closed by order of the school district administrator because of a threat to the health or safety of pupils or school personnel, but not including inclement weather."

I suggested to Jennifer that perhaps your office might want to conform your draft to the new language in AB 316. In other words, change the language to require notification within 24 hours on days on which school is closed under the new language in s. 115.01 (10) (a) 3.

Specifically referencing subparagraph 3 rather than using the broader reference to 115.01 (10) (a) would narrow the bill somewhat but still preserve its intent.

Jennifer indicated that the DPI would be comfortable with this approach.

I note that Assembly Bill 316 has passed both houses and was enrolled yesterday. The governor is expected to sign it into law. Referencing the new language created by AB 316 in your bill would simplify matters for school boards but still meet the DPI's need to provide the federal Centers for Disease Control with timely notification of school closings for health-related reasons. I hope this information is helpful. Please contact me if you have any questions.

Dan,

Thanks again for taking a look at the bill, I really appreciate it. It is my understanding that under current law, school boards are required to notify DHS if a school has been closed for a health related reason. However, school boards are not required to notify DPI of a health-related closure (I know that there is a form that school boards submit to DPI, but it is not statutorily required). This issue was brought to our attention by DHS. Given the early concerns regarding H1N1, we felt that it would make sense for DPI to know right away about a health-related closure, rather than having them find out about it elsewhere. Receiving notification early on would help DHS and DPI coordinate on a response and plan for action. Nothing more nothing less. I hope that helps-please let me know if you need any additional information. Have a great night!

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
