Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Bill Summary:

Class B disabled permits are issued to allow the holder to hunt within 50 feet of a roadway, possess a loaded uncased firearm and shoot from a stationary vehicle, use a crossbow and/or use an electric trolling motor to troll for fish on waters where motors and/or trolling are otherwise prohibited.

This bill would require the DNR to issue a Class B disabled permit to any person that a doctor states has a terminal illness, regardless

of the person's current physical abilities or how many years the person may be expected to live. The bill also does not allow the DNR

to examine any of that person's medical records.

Fiscal Estimate:

The Department would need to amend all disabled permit publications to explain to the public the eligibility opportunity. It is likely the DNR would see some increase in the number of applications for Class B disabled permits, but does not expect that this would be a large number. There would likely not be any additional cost in updating the regulations pamphlets as the necessary changes could be made the next time the pamphlets are normally reprinted. The application forms are all electronically maintained and printed out as needed. Changes to the electronic application would simply require some staff time to make the updates.

There are currently approximately 7,328 individuals who possess Class B disabled permits.
