Re: change to opens records requests

Rep. Vruwink would like to draft legislation which would make the following change to the open records statutes: When a request is made for open records relating to audio recordings (example, 9-1-1 calls), the government department or agency receiving the request may release a written transcript of the audio recording but not the actual audio recording itself. The transcript would be subject to normal open records law.

We have met with Ron Sklansky from the Legislative Council and we believe that this request would satisfy the intent of the open records law without subjecting family members to undue invasion of privacy when recordings of this nature are subject to open records requests by media outlets. These recordings are usually made in connection with attempts of friends or family seeking help from law enforcement in an emergency. The transcripts should suffice without causing additional stress at a later date to the person who made the call.

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AN ACT ...; relating to: access to public records maintained in audio format

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Currently, except as otherwise provided by law, a requester of a public record that is in the form of a comprehensible audio tape recording has the right to receive > a copy of the recording substantially as audible as the original. This bill provides, instead, that except as otherwise provided by law, a requester of a public record that is in the form of an audio recording has the right to receive a transcript of the recording or, if the state or local governmental unit having custody of the record permits, a copy of the recording substantially as audible as the original.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. 19.35 (1) (c) of the statutes is amended to read:

19.35 (1) (c) Except as otherwise provided by law, any requester has a right to receive from an authority having custody of a record which is in the form of a comprehensible audio tape recording a transcript of the recording or, if the authority having custody of the record permits, a copy of the tape recording substantially as

- audible as the original. The authority may instead provide a transcript of the recording to the requester if he or she requests.



1 INSERT 1A:

, except as otherwise provided under statutory or common law, and except that the custodian of the recording may withhold access under a "balancing test" that weighs the public interest in withholding access against the strong public interest in providing access. This bill creates another exception for 911 calls. Under the bill, subject to the exceptions under current law, a requester has the right to inspect and copy a transcript of a 911 call, but does not have the right to inspect or copy an audio recording of a 911 call.

2 **INSERT 2-3:**

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SECTION 1. 256.35 (9m) of the statutes is created to read:

256.35 (9m) Audio recording confidentiality. An audio recording of a call by a person dialing the digits "911" is not subject to inspection or copying under s. 19.35.

A transcript of such a recording is subject to inspection and copying under s. 19.35.

SECTION 2. Initial applicability.

(1) The treatment of section 256.35 (9m) of the statutes first applies to inspection or copying requests made under section 19.35 of the statutes on the effective date of this subsection.
