

This bill allows a physician, physician assistant, or certified advanced practice nurse to provide expedited partner therapy. The bill defines "expedited partner therapy" as prescribing, dispensing, or furnishing to a patient an antimicrobial drug y to be used by the sexual partner or partners of the patient to treat a chlamydial infection, gonorrhea, or trichomoniasis without physical examination of the sexual * partner or partner. The bill exempts a physician, physician's assistant, or certified advanced practice nurse prescriber who provides expedited partner therapy from civil liability for injury to or the death of a patient's sexual partner unless an act or omission of the physician, physician's assistant, or certified advanced practice nurse prescriber involves reckless, wanton, or intentional misconduct. The bill also exempts a pharmacist who dispenses an antimicrobial drug for the treatment of a chlamydial infection, gonorrhea, or trichomoniasis from civil liability for injury to or the death of a patient's sexual partner unless an act or omission of the pharmacist involves reckless, wanton, or intentional misconduct.

We sent the EPT draft bill out to various groups for feedback such as the Pharmacy Society of WI, the Pharmacy Examining Board, and the Wisconsin Medical Society. The following edits are in response to their comments or suggestions.

We have one major and a couple of minor edits for EPT draft bill 3463/2:

On Page 3, Section 5 (b), line 18 we want to revise "recommended" to "identified"

The major edit is on Page 4, section 2, lines 8-12

We suggest revising these lines to read: A prescription order for an antimicrobial drug prepared under this subsection shall include the name and address of the patient's sexual partner if known. If the sexual partner's name is unknown and an attempt to obtain the sexual partner's name was made, the prescription order may include in ordinary bold-faced capital letters, the words, "expedited partner therapy" or the letters "EPT." The sexual partner's prescription shall be separate from the practitioner's patient's prescription.

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- The intent is to not include "expedited partner therapy" or "EPT" on the prescription if the partner's name is known, and highlight that the partner's name on the prescription is preferred. Also, we intend to make it clear that the patient's prescription order and the sexual partner's prescription order are two separate orders and not on the same prescription.
- √ Page 5, section 7, lines 8-10, there was a question as to whether the way this is worded would limit the Pharmacy Examining Board so that the only thing not included as "unprofessional conduct" is EPT. They are concerned the way it is currently written might unintentionally limit their decision making authority. They suggested creating a new subsection rather than crossing out "is not limited to."
- √ Page 7, section 11, line 3 we want to revise "if known, and the words" to "if known, or the words"

There were also a few edits to the analysis which include changes to reflect the suggestions above.

- ✓ In the first sentence, "or certified advanced practice nurse" should be "or certified advanced practice nurse prescriber"
 - ✓ "Recommended" should be revised to "identified" in the third sentence.

The last sentence of the first paragraph should be revised to ". . . if, known, or the words "expedited partner therapy" or the letters "EPT" in bold-faced capital letters if the name is unknown."

I will call to follow up with you regarding these edits to include in the next draft of LRB 3463.

This draft incorporates changes proposed in an e-mail from Marisa Stanley, at the Wisconsin Division of Public Health, to me. I forwarded this e-mail, dated December 3, 2009, to your office. I have the following comments for your consideration:

1. Definition of unprofessional conduct.

In her e-mail, Ms. Stanley includes the following comment about LRB-3463/2:

Page 5, section 7, lines 8-10, there was a question as to whether the way this is worded would limit the Pharmacy Examining Board so that the only thing not included as "unprofessional conduct" is EPT. They are concerned the way it is currently written might unintentionally limit their decision making authority. They suggested creating a new subsection rather than crossing out "is not limited to."

Section 450.10 (1) (a) (intro.), as revised in LRB-3463/2, reads as follows:

"In this subsection, "unprofessional conduct" includes <u>any of the following</u>, but is not limited to <u>does not include the dispensing of an antimicrobial drug for expedited partner therapy as described in s. 450.11 (1g):"</u>

I don't believe any additional revisions to this section are necessary for the following reasons:

- a. Current LRB drafting conventions discourage the use of "is not limited to" after the word, "includes," as the phrase is redundant."
- b. The use of "includes any of the following" rather than "means" in the definition of "unprofessional conduct" indicates that the list that follows the colon is partial, rather than complete.
- c. Although the amendment to s. 450.10 (1) (a) (intro.), stats., does expressly affect the scope of the examining board's authority to determine what does and does not constitute "unprofessional conduct," the change in scope is both very narrow and very specific: the examining board may not determine that the dispensing of antimicrobial drugs for EPT constitutes unprofessional conduct. The amendment does not otherwise

limit the authority of the examining board to determine what does or does not constitute unprofessional conduct. In fact, each time the examining board determines what <u>does</u> constitute unprofessional conduct, the examining board is also determining by its silence, or by omission, what <u>does not</u> constitute unprofessional conduct.

Okay?

2. Prescription orders.

Ms. Stanley's e-mail also directs me to add the following sentence to proposed s. 448.035 (2):

"The sexual partner's prescription shall be separate from the practitioner's patient's prescription."

Ms. Stanley indicates that "we intend to make it clear that the patient's prescription order and the sexual partner's prescription order are two separate orders and not on the same prescription."

I don't believe this addition is necessary. Proposed s. 448.035 does not authorize a practitioner to combine the prescription order of a patient with that of the patient's sexual partner. Proposed s. 448.035, by its terms, is limited to and authorizes a practitioner to provide "expedited partner therapy." "Expedited partner therapy" is defined in proposed s. 448.035 (1) (c) as:

"to prescribe, dispense, or furnish to a patient an antimicrobial drug <u>to be used</u> <u>by a sexual partner of the patient</u> to treat a chlamydial infection, gonorrhea, or trichomoniasis <u>without physical examination of the sexual partner</u>." (emphasis added).

That is, proposed s. 448.035 does not apply to a practitioner prescribing an antimicrobial drug to the <u>patient for use by the patient;</u> presumably, a practitioner is already authorized to prescribe an antimicrobial drug to a patient?

However, perhaps I am not familiar with common practice of practitioners. Is it acceptable or common practice for a practitioner to combine the prescription orders of two patients for antimicrobial drugs when the sexual partner of the patient is present for examination? For that matter, is it acceptable or common practice for a practitioner to *ever* combine the prescription orders of two patients?

Please advise.

3. Changes to liability provision.

Note that I adjusted the language of proposed s. 448.035 (4) (a) to eliminate an inappropriate use of the defined term, "expedited partner therapy" on p. 4, line 21 of LRB-3463/2. Specifically, I replaced "provided to that person as expedited partner therapy" with "prescribed, dispensed, or furnished." Let me know if you have any concerns about this change.

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limit the authority of the examining board to determine what does or does not constitute unprofessional conduct. In fact, each time the examining board determines what <u>does</u> constitute unprofessional conduct, the examining board is also determining by its silence, or by omission, what <u>does not</u> constitute unprofessional conduct.

Touched base with DHS, and here's our thoughts/answers to your questions:

- 1. We agree that no additional revisions are necessary, and appreciate the reasoning which we will pass along to the Pharmacy Examining Board.
- 2. We agree that this addition is not necessary and will address this clarification in the guidance provided to prescribers. There is anecdotal information that some prescribers do combine the prescription order for the two patients by prescribing a double dose to the patient who is present for the examination. However, this is not acceptable practice and this legislation would prevent providers from writing a double dose prescription to treat the partner in the future by allowing them to write a prescription for the partner.
- 3. We have no concerns about this change.
