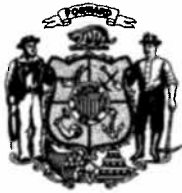

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) issues various licenses, permits, and other approvals (approvals) that authorize the hunting, fishing, and trapping of wild animals. Current law establishes fees for the issuance of these approvals depending on the type of activity for which the approval is issued. Under certain circumstances, such as for some approvals issued to persons who are under the age of 18, DNR charges a reduced fee. DNR charges a further reduced fee of \$4.25 for a hunting approval issued to a person who is 10 or 11 years old. Under current law, a person who is 10 or 11 years old may hunt only under the authority of the hunting mentorship program administered by DNR. Generally, DNR also charges a reduced fee to issue a duplicate hunting approval.

This bill establishes a reduced fee of \$4.25 for a duplicate hunting license issued to a person who is 10 or 11 years old.

Hi Stephanie,

We have discovered another oversight from the Mentored Hunting bill that Ann might want to consider fixing at the same time as this fix for the duplicate license fee.

It deals with the age at which a first time hunter education course graduate is eligible to use their certificate of accomplishment as their free small game hunting privilege. Everyone was thinking that 10 and 11 year olds who took and passed Hunter education could also take advantage of this free small game license privilege that first year they passed the course. However, after a closer reading of the current statutory language that was not amended under the Mentorship bill, a person who is 10 or 11 must wait until they turn 12 before they can use their certificate in place of a small game hunting license. This will create confusion trying to explain why some first year graduates can get the free privilege right away, and others (10 & 11 year olds) must wait until they are 12. Additionally, if a 10 or 11 yr old who has completed H. E. does not turn 12 until half way into the open season, they will have had to purchase a license to hunt before they turned 12 and the free privilege would be of no value for the remainder of the season.

We are suggesting the following minor amendment to fix this issue, which would only require replacing the number 12 with a 10 in s. 29.304(1)(d).

29.304(1)(d)
(d) Restrictions on validity of certificate of accomplishment. A person under 12 years of age may obtain a certificate of accomplishment if he or she complies with the requirements of s. 29.591 (4) but that certificate is not valid for the hunting of small game until that person becomes ~~12~~ 10 years of age.
