Dear Honorable Senator Risser and Honorable Representative Black,

This message is to respectfully request your assistance by sponsoring legislation this session that would enable to the Village of Shorewood Hills to secure three additional Class B liquor licenses.(on premises consumption) We are currently restricted to four licenses all of which are now issued. The Board was recently placed in the uncomfortable position of having to decide whether to issue our one available license that would allow a closed Pizza Hut to reopen as a Laredo's restaurant or hold it for a pending project that would increase our tax base by \$12-14 M. by redeveloping the Danford Plaza into a four story mixed use development with underground parking and LEED certification. In the meantime, I testified at a legislative public hearing that would exempt the quota for establishments that serve 50% or more in food to alcohol sales. It does not appear right now that legislation is going anywhere very quickly.

After the hearing, a representative from the Tavern League approached me and said that although they were opposed to that legislation, they sympathized with our situation and would support special legislation giving us some additional licenses. This recently occurred in Middleton and Monona.

It is ironic that the south side of University Avenue in Madison could be lined with establishments serving alcohol, while on the north side in the Village we are restricted. Our circumstances are just different, being a small village that serves a large metropolitan area in terms of retail and shopping. The population quota just does not make sense in our situation.

The village is not interested in becoming a strip of bars, but additional licenses would allow us to promote more mixed use dense redevelopment on University Avenue and increased tax base. I have attached my note to the board when they tabled the liquor license for the Laredo's. At the next meeting, the board granted the license with the hope that we could get some additional licenses through legislation. I have also included some draft language. Your help is appreciated. Please contact me with any questions.

Consider Class B combination liquor license for Laredo's located at 4000 University Avenue

The Village has four liquor licenses for on premises consumption. Three of them are issued. Those issued being Blackhawk Country Club, Sai Bi Thong, and Noodles. The license issued to Pizza Hut was surrendered when it closed. The Board has broad discretion regarding the issuance of these licenses and they are of value especially as they relate to further development and diversification of restaurants in the village. Should the village wish to hold on to this license it can deny the application. The denial must be in writing. I am not suggesting we deny just making sure the option is open to you. The following and other written reasoning can be utilized to the degree you wish: The Village Board of the Village of Shorewood Hills hereby denies application for a Class B combination liquor license for Laredo's to be located at 4000 University Avenue. Denial is based in part due to the Village being restricted to four liquor licenses, three of which have been already issued. The one remaining license provides the Village an important economic development tool to increase its tax base and to attract mixed use projects that include restaurants that require a liquor license. A major goal of the village, articulated in both of its adopted neighborhood plans for Doctor's Park and Pyare Square are mixed use redevelopments to include housing, retail and office. Redevelopment proposals for mixed use development often contain a restaurant component and the Village has entertained proposed projects that include restaurant /pub components that require a liquor license. These projects have the potential of increasing the Villages assessed value by as much as \$14,000,000. In the interest of preserving the ability of the village to substantially increase its tax base, and promote mixed use redevelopment the application is denied.
