



As we discussed, what you could do is set up an appropriation line in s. 20.285 for GPR appropriations to the new program. The draft would also create statutory language on what the money in the appropriation line is to be used for ("to be used for loan repayments under s. 36.63 and costs associated with the repayments"). But the dollar amounts would be zero in the appropriation line for each year of this biennium. Then next session, if you decide to put some money in the line, the schedule would be changed (probably through the Budget Bill), but the statutory language wouldn't need to be created.

You may want to run this by Peter Grant to see if makes sense.


