We are reintroducing legislation that will take communication between law enforcement and the people they serve to a new level in Wisconsin.

This bill establishes the Wisconsin Crime Alert Network (CAN), an initiative that provides local law enforcement the ability to quickly alert the business community and the general public about a crime trend or a suspect that may threaten them or their business.

Participation in the Crime Alert Network is voluntary. Law enforcement officials send out electronic communications to targeted businesses and members of the community. For example, in the event of a series of ephedrine-product pharmacy robberies in northwestern Wisconsin, an alert could be sent out by each responding agency to pharmacies in the region who are members of the network. By providing information to the business community about criminal activity, law enforcement can increase its eyes and ears. More suspects are caught and more runaways are recovered. Businesses have an interest in participating because these alerts can be targeted to criminal activity that affects their particular business or area. Safer streets and theft prevention can enhance business while promoting public safety.

The Wisconsin Crime Alert Network requires NO state GPR funding. The system will be started with Department of Justice discretionary settlement funds and will be funded on a continuing basis with the annual membership fees from the network's participants. This proposal is modeled after Minnesota's Crime Alert Network, which has been in place for over a decade and is also self-funded by voluntary participants.

As is the case in Minnesota, a Crime Alert Network in Wisconsin will be a low-cost yet highly effective way to quickly capture those who have committed criminal acts and prevent others from becoming offenders.

Last session, this bill received broad support from a wide range of business and law enforcement groups. It passed the Assembly Criminal Justice Committee and the Senate Committee on Small Business, Emergency Preparedness, Technical Colleges, and Consumer Protection unanimously. It also passed the Assembly on a voice vote.

1 AN ACT *to amend* 20.455 (3) (g); and *to create* 20.455 (2) (gp) and 165.785 of the  
2 statutes; **relating to:** an integrated crime alert network and making an  
3 appropriation.

### *Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau*

Current law requires the Department of Justice (DOJ) to perform criminal investigations for crimes of statewide import and to provide information to all law enforcement officers within the state, to federal investigators, and to law enforcement agencies in other states. Current law requires DOJ to provide informational bulletins by mail or its telecommunications system.

This bill allows DOJ to create an additional informational network to provide information regarding known or suspected criminal activity, crime prevention, and missing or endangered persons to state agencies, law enforcement officers, and members of the private sector. Under the bill, DOJ may charge a fee to members of the private sector that opt to receive information from the network.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

4 SECTION 1. 20.455 (2) (gp) of the statutes is created to read:

## SECTION 1

1 20.455 (2) (gp) *Crime information alerts.* All moneys received as fee payments  
2 under s. 165.785 (2) and all moneys received as gifts, grants, or donations for the  
3 provision of services under s. 165.785 (1) and the provision of a crime alert network.

4 **SECTION 2.** 20.455 (3) (g) of the statutes is amended to read:

5 20.455 (3) (g) *Gifts, grants and proceeds.* All moneys received from gifts and  
6 grants and all proceeds from services, conferences, and sales of publications and  
7 promotional materials to carry out the purposes for which made or collected, except  
8 as provided in sub. (2) (gm) and (gp).

9 **SECTION 3.** 165.785 of the statutes is created to read:

10 **165.785 Crime alert network. (1)** In addition to its duties under ss. 165.50  
11 and 165.78, the department may develop, administer, and maintain an integrated  
12 crime alert network to provide information regarding known or suspected criminal  
13 activity, crime prevention, and missing or endangered persons to state agencies, law  
14 enforcement officers, and members of the private sector.

15 **(2)** The department may charge a fee to members of the private sector who  
16 receive information under sub. (1).

17 **SECTION 4. Nonstatutory provision.**

18 **(1) POSITION AUTHORIZATION.** The authorized FTE positions for the department  
19 of justice are increased by 1.0 PR position, to be funded from the appropriation under  
20 section 20.455 (2) (gp) of the statutes, as created by this act, for the purpose of  
21 developing, administering, and maintaining an integrated crime alert network.
