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## 2009 ASSEMBLY BILL 795

March 2, 2010 – Introduced by Representatives Kleefisch, A. Ott, Ballweg and Brooks. Referred to Committee on Natural Resources.

- 1 AN ACT *to amend* 33.28 (2) (intro.), 33.28 (2) (a) and 33.28 (2) (b) of the statutes;
- relating to: membership of boards of commissioners established for public
  inland lake protection and rehabilitation districts.

## Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a county may establish one or more public inland lake protection and rehabilitation districts (lake districts) in the county. A board of commissioners is established to manage the affairs of a lake district, which include enacting boating ordinances and receiving state funding for local water safety patrols. Under current law, the board consists of five members, one of whom is a member of the governing body of the city, village, or town within which the largest portion of the district lies, as measured by property tax valuation, and who is selected by that body. Under this bill, the governing body may either appoint one of its members to serve on the board or another person who resides in the city, village, or town.
