## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

Under the bill, a county sheriff may collect a new fee of up to \$25 from a person who has requested that he or she be fingerprinted to cover the cost of such fingerprinting. A county sheriff would also be permitted to collect a new fee of up to \$25 from a person who is arrested to cover the cost of fingerprinting, photographing, information filing, and gathering other information. Any fees collected from an arrestee who is not changed with a crime, for whom charges are dismissed, or who is acquitted, must be refunded.

The Department of Revenue (DOR) does not maintain data on the number of persons who request that they be fingerprinted or on the number of persons arrested and the dispositions of the cases for those persons who are arrested. Data on the number of persons arrested, and on the police agency which made the arrest, are maintained by the Wisconsin Office of Justice Assistance.

DOR is unable to estimate the increase in county sheriff fees that this bill could engender. Any increase in fees could potentially reduce the amount of other county revenue, such as the county property tax levy, needed to support county sheriff departments compared to current law.
