Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Prosecutors provided different responses concerning a fiscal impact upon enactment of this bill. Some felt that the bill dealt only with the civil liability statute of limitations and would not have a direct effect on DA offices. Others, however, believed the enactment of the bill would increase their workload and have a fiscal impact because a long delay in reporting a case requires additional time to review and research the case before determining whether or not to make a charge, in addition to the time required to prosecute the case if it is charged.
