Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill makes a variety of changes to current law associated with the intoxicated operation of all-terrain vehicles, snowmobiles, motorboats, and motor vehicles.

It is expected that an indeterminate amount of revenue will come in to the State School Fund from citations resulting from operating a recreational vehicle while a person's recreational vehicle privileges have been suspended and/or operating a recreational vehicle while their motor vehicle privileges have been suspended/revoked due to a motor vehicle related OWI or second offense recreational vehicle OWI within a five year period. It is unknown how many violations will occur. During the 2007-09 time period, an average of 456 people were arrested for recreational vehicle OWI that would result in a suspension of their recreational vehicle operating privileges under this bill. It is unknown how many of these people would then operate after their rec. vehicle privileges are suspended. In 2009, there were approximately 455,500 motor vehicle operators that had their driver's licenses revoked or suspended for an OWI related violation and who would be in violation if they operated a recreational vehicle. It is unknown how many of these people own or would possibly operate a recreational vehicle in violation.

These changes will require programming modifications to the DNR Violation database for which costs are estimated at between 0 - \$1500. There will be additional costs resulting from updating Department forms, pamphlets and training personnel. These are all one time costs that can be absorbed by the Department.

The bill also makes changes to the amount of revenues available for Supplemental Trail Aids. Under current law \$15 from the sale of every \$35 Snowmobile Trail pass is earmarked and appropriated for supplemental snowmobile trail maintenance aids. This bill would increase that amount to \$32. In FY 2009 27, 991 of these passes were sold. If that level of sales were to continue, the additional \$17 would generate about \$475,800 for the program over the current level of \$419,900.
