Can you please draft legislation regarding the sale and distribution of raffle tickets under, Chapter 563 (Wisconsin Statutes) and GAME 44 (Wisconsin Administrative Code) that will:

- 1) allow for an option to enter a raffle without purchase by allowing for tickets to state "No Purchase Necessary to Enter": and.
- 2) say that the distribution and sale of raffle tickets does not have to be "face-to-face" in person.

The objective is to:

1) allow for the mailing of raffle tickets under USPS regulations;

2) address the fact that the DOA says a licensee can not have a raffle with no purchase necessary option; and,

2), address the fact that the DOA says the sale must be made "face-to-face" in person.

Non Profit Raffle Alert

The United States Postal Service (USPS) is strictly enforcing regulations on mailing raffle tickets. If you plan to mail raffle tickets for a fundraiser, you must meet certain requirements or USPS could legally refuse to accept your mail. While it is legal to include advertising for a raffle, including a raffle or lottery ticket in a mailing is strictly prohibited unless you follow USPS guidelines.

Raffles are considered lotteries if they incorporate three elements: prize, chance and consideration (fee to enter). Tickets for such raffles are considered unlawful mail matter and are nonmailable. However, when one or more of those three elements are eliminated from a raffle, it no longer constitutes a lottery for postal purposes. For instance, consideration can be eliminated if persons may enter without payment of a fee. Thus, a non profit organization that designs a ticket for a raffle where it is clear that a donation is not required to enter may use the mail to distribute the tickets.

To avoid potential problems USPS requires the ticket makes clear that no payment is required to enter a raffle. The following elements should appear on each ticket in a mailing:

1. Use the wording "suggested donation" before the price of the ticket.

2. Use the wording "no donation required to enter" or add a check box "

Please enter my name in the drawing. I do not wish to make a

donation at this time."

An alternative is to not include a ticket in the mailing. It is legal to advertise a raffle by mail, but you should still use the phrase "suggested donation" if you list the price of a ticket on the advertisement.

By law, the purchase price must be printed on the ticket (563.93 (1) (c)). Anyone putting a "suggested" price is clearly expecting payment and the event is obviously not free. Further, "donation" is a misnomer because no entry into a gambling game is tax-deductible.

563.93 (1) (d) states the purchaser ID info requirement.

Based on my understanding of the particular situation, the raffle tickets are free – if you want a free one, but they do have a suggested donation printed on them, which they generally receive. Are you saying that if a purchase is not required to enter, then it is not considered a raffle ticket, although a donation is made for most tickets? If the answer is yes, that it is not a raffle ticket, would the organization also not need a license to distribute the tickets and collect donations?

Also, can you please point out to me where, in the statutes or administrative code, it says that the purchase of a raffle ticket must be made in person so that the purchaser is present to fill out their ID information on the drawing stub and that they be given their receipt portion at that time of purchase? I am only finding GAME 44.03 (4) (a) saying that the purchasers portion must be provided to the purchaser.

By statute definition, a raffle involves the purchase of a ticket. Thus, no purchase required means what is being mailed is not a raffle ticket. Since they are free, such an event makes a poor fund-raiser, however.

State law requires that, when purchasing a raffle ticket, that the purchaser be present to fill out their ID information on the drawing stub and that they be given their receipt portion at that time of purchase. So, since the purchase must be essentially face-to-face, the mail issue really is moot for us. BW

- (3) No licensed organization may permit another organization or individual to use the licensed organization's license to conduct a raffle.
- (4) No licensed organization may permit a raffle ticket to be utilized for any purpose other than as a gaming instrument. History: CR 04-073: cr. Register May 2005 No. 593, eff. 6-1-05.

Administration Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a local religious, charitable, service, fraternal, veterans, or * other not-for-profit organization may conduct a raffle it to obtains a raffle license from the Department of Adminsitration. Currently, an organization conducting a raffle must provide a person who purchases a raffle ticket, the purchaser's portion of the ticket at the time of the ticket purchase! This bill provides that the organization must provide the ticket purchaser the purchaser's portion of the ticket before the raffle drawing, but need not provide it at the time of purchase.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 563.93 (4m) of the statutes is created to read:

563.93 (4m) The organization that conducts a raffle under a Class A license shall provide the purchaser of a raffle ticket or calendar the purchaser's portion of the ticket or calendar before the raffle drawing, but need not provide it to the purchaser at the time of purchase.
