1 **AN ACT** *to repeal* 119.23 (2) (b); and *to amend* 119.23 (2) (a) (intro.) of the
2 statutes; **relating to:** the limit on the number of pupils who may attend a
3 private school under the Milwaukee Parental Choice Program.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, the number of pupils who may attend a private school under the Milwaukee Parental Choice Program is limited to 22,500. This bill eliminates the cap.
