## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

Under current law, W-2 participants who are required to undergo drug testing based on previous criminal convictions who test positive for a controlled substance are required to have their W-2 benefits reduced by 15% for not fewer than 12 months. The sanctioned amount is witheld by the agency when issuing the monthly benefit check.

Between January 2009 and January 2010, there were four cases where participants received sanctions due to testing positive for a controlled substance. Based on an average monthly benefit amount of \$510, the 15% witheld equals \$76.50 per month. (\$76.50 x 12 months = \$918 per case. (\$918 x 4 cases = \$3,672/annually)

AB 874 would (1) change the percent of the sanctioned amount from 15% to 50% and (2) require that the agency provide by rule how the sanctioned amount would be distributed to the dependent children in the W-2 group in the form of a protective payment or a vendor payment instead of being witheld by DCF.

The fiscal effect of this change is estimated at less than \$4,000 and could be absorbed within the agency's existing budget.
