

Redraft Instructions for WCC Bill-2009 AB 910

Jeff:

Reps. Clark and Mason held a working group session yesterday on 2009 AB 910--the WCC draft--to come up with drafting instructions for a substitute amendment. I attended the meeting, presented your issues, answered questions on the bill, and took drafting instructions. Below you will find the drafting instructions for the substitute amendment. The bill will be before the Joint Committee on Finance a week Friday and so they would like the amendment to review before that time. They have also expressed a wish that the substitute amendment not contain an LRB analysis.

SECTION 1: They are contemplating adding additional members to the WCC Board. For now, keep as is unless you hear otherwise.

SECTION 2: Eliminate this provision from draft.

SECTION 3: Eliminate from draft the definition of "public lands" in s. 16.24 (2) (e).

In s. 16.24 (4), specify that the nonprofit corporation that will manage the WCC program shall "hire or enroll" the work crews.

In s. 16.24 (5) (a) the intent is that only the nonprofit corporation that manages the WCC can submit applications to the WCC Board for approval. The

nonprofit corporation will work with sponsors, but it is only the nonprofit corporation manager that submits the projects to the WCC Board for approval.

In s. 16.24 (5) (a) 3., provide that the educational opportunities provided to the work crews are individualized to each work crew member depending on his or

her needs, qualifications, experiences, etc. In other words, the opportunities must be tailored to individual work crew members.

In 16.24 (5) (a) (4), provide that they must visit postsecondary educational institutions, such as technical colleges and the UW colleges. The would like

specific references to technical colleges and UW colleges.

Eliminate s. 16.24 (6) from draft.

In s. 16.24 (10) (a), provide that the nonprofit corporation that manages the WCC program submits the application. The application must also provide that

the funds received for a project are paid directly to the nonprofit corporation. Also, make certain that the applications can be for grants provided by any entity

and not just the National and Community Service Board.

In s. 16.24 (10) (b), broaden to include all applications to any entity and provide that the grant is to the nonprofit corporation that manages the WCC.

In s. 16.24 (12 (b), broaden to not only technical colleges but UW colleges and any other postsecondary education institution.

SECTION 9, 10, 11,12, and 13: Eliminate all of these provisions from the draft. Instead, for funding purposes, create a PR-S C appropriation that consists of moneys

transferred to this appropriation by the secretary of administration from appropriations and funds identified by the secretary. The new appropriation will have

the same purpose as the one in s. 20.505 (4) (q) in the bill. The secretary must come up with a plan to transfer moneys to this appropriation and submit

the plan to JFC no later than 90 days after bill's effective date. The plan is submitted under a passive review

arrangement and will identify the funding

sources and amounts. A more permanent source of future funding will be addressed in the 2011-13 biennial budget.

SECTION 17: Move up the dates for the expiration of the terms of the initial WCC Board members to reflect the fact that the bill will take effect upon publication and not on July 1, 2011.

SECTION 18: Eliminate this section from the draft.

AN ACT to amend 16.22 (2) (h), 16.75 (1) (a) 1. and 24.80; and to create 15.105 (32), 16.24, 16.705 (1L), 16.705 (9), 16.71 (5s), 16.75 (13), 20.505 (4) (jm), 20.505 (4) (qm), 66.0903 (5) (d), 66.0904 (5) (d) and 103.49 (3g) (d) of the statutes; relating to: establishment of a Wisconsin conservation corps anthorizing a transfer of Moneys appropriated to program, extending the time limit for emergency rule procedures, providing an one exemption from emergency rule procedures, granting rule-making authority, and making appropriations.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This will creates a Wisconsin conservation corps (WCC) program that seeks to protect, enhance, and provide access to Wisconsin's natural heritage and encourage and enable young people to learn the value of work in a natural setting by providing employment training and career pathways. The will also creates a WCC Board, which is the policy-making body of the WCC and is attached to the Department of Administration (DOA). The WCC Board consists of the secretary of natural resources or his or her designee; the executive secretary of the Board of Commissioners of Public Lands; two representatives to the assembly, appointed as are members of assembly standing committees; two senators, appointed as are members of senate standing committees; one member of a nongovernmental organization that has expertise in conservation matters or that represents

employees who work in conservation activities, for a three-year term; and two members of the faculty employed by a technical college district board, appointed by the state Technical College System Board, for three-year terms.

The bill brovides funding for the WCC program from the conservation fund, the state normal school fund (a state trust fund that derives revenue from federal land grants), and from pregram fees that the hoard may assess to sponsors of projects: Under the bar, DOA provides and staff services to the board and the board has no other The directs the board to enter into an agreement with a nonprofit corporation/that has demonstrated experience in natural resource conservation and youth training to manage and administer the WCC program. The manager then retains, trains, and supervises work crews to carry out each project. The manager also identifies, reviews, and recommends proposed projects for the approval of the board. The bill requires the board to ensure that projects are equally distributed across technical college districts to the greatest extent possible, and to ensure that at least one project is located in each technical college district in each year.

The ban provides that a project must be designed to carry out a specific goal within a defined period of time must be focused on the conservation or enjoyment of natural resources and must have a specific, beneficial, physical effect. Projects may include new/trail construction, trail rehabilitation, invasive species management, bridge and boardwalk construction, reforestation, timber stand improvement, stream bank stabilization, erosion control, rain garden installation, prairie restoration, historical site preservation, recreation site maintenance, wild land fire hazard reduction and fuels management, lake and stream restoration, boundary marking, fencing, landscaping, carpentry, and data collection for scientific research. The permits local governments or nonprofit corporations to submit applications to sponsor projects. A project application must identify the proposed project and provide a detailed plan for working on the project. In addition, the application must contain an enumeration of the number of work crews that will work on the project and a determination that work crew members would be eligible to participate in a youth corps program administered by the National and Community Service Board (NCSB) and other requirements under the WCC program, as well as a plan for training the work crew members, providing transportation to the project work sites, making available educational opportunities for work crew members while they are employed on the projects, for assisting work crew members in making full use of all benefits provided under such a youth corps program, and for visiting a technical college to familiarize the crew members with application and enrollment procedures, programs, and course offerings.

The billials of threets NCSB, which utilizes federal and state funding to award grants to persons providing national and community service programs, to first allocate funding for grants to provide work for at least 240 participants in each fiscal year in youth corps programs provided by the WCC Board, to the extent that funding is available to MCSB and NCSB receives valid applications for the grants. Currently NCSB is directed only to give priority in awarding grants, to the greatest extent practicable, to persons providing youth corps programs.

The self requires each sponsor of a WCC project to do both of the following: upon completion of the project, erect a permanent plaque at each work site identifying the site as a WCC project; and submit a report to the board identifying the number of work crew members who enrolled at a technical college upon completion of the project and their status on the first anniversary of completion of the project.

The bill exempts services performed by WCC work crews from compliance with requirements for state and local public works projects to adhere to current prevailing wage scales. The bill permits the board to retain its manager and other state agencies to engage a WCC crew on a project without complying with state procurement laws, including requirements for public notice to and competitive solicitation of contractors and limitations on the circumstances when contractual services may be obtained.

Finally, the requires the board to submit an annual report to the legislature identifying the projects completed in each year or that are in the process of completion as of the end of that year.

Thanks for sending this rcap. I'm not sure if this got to you Friday - but related to the changes you laid out, below are alterations that Rep. Mason and I discussed last week. Please let me know if we still have time to make these chages and get it out by tommorrow.

- 1). RE: Board make up, Cory and I spoke about this yesterday. I would like to add 1 member representing **UW Extension**. We should also add 1 member representative of a non-profit doing **youth training programs** (use the same language as the conservation NGO rep).
- 2). We want to restore language about crews working on public lands, inclusive of any lands on which there is a public ownership interest (public financing or easement, etc.), and should also be incidentally inclusive of limited work on other lands if such work is directly related to accomplishing a project on lands where there is a public ownership interest.
- 3). Keep the langauge on 240 crew members, however change 240 to a minimum of 300, and change WCC to "youth conservation corps." The idea is to keep the allocation, but not specifically target WCC.

Please let us know if there is time to make these changes.

ASSEMBLY SUBSTITUTE AMENDMENT.

TO 2009 ASSEMBLY BILL 910

AN ACT to amend 16.75 (1) (a) 1.; and to create 15.105 (32), 16.24, 16.705 (1L), 16.705 (9), 16.71 (5s), 16.75 (13), 20.505 (4) (kc), 66.0903 (5) (d), 66.0904 (5) (d) and 103.49 (3g) (d) of the statutes; relating to: establishment of a Wisconsin conservation corps program, authorizing a transfer of moneys appropriated to one or more state agencies, extending the time limit for emergency rule procedures, providing an exemption from emergency rule procedures, granting rule-making authority, and making an appropriation.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This substitute amendment creates a Wisconsin conservation corps (WCC) program that seeks to protect, enhance, and provide access to Wisconsin's natural heritage and encourage and enable young people to learn the value of work in a natural setting by providing employment training and career pathways. The substitute amendment also creates a WCC Board, which is the policy-making body of the WCC and is attached to the Department of Administration (DOA). The WCC Board consists of the secretary of natural resources or his or her designee; the executive secretary of the Board of Commissioners of Public Lands; two representatives to the assembly, appointed as are members of assembly standing

>

committees; two senators appointed as are members of senate standing committees; one member of a nongovernmental organization that has expertise in conservation matters or that represents employees who work in conservation activities, for a three-year term; and two members of the faculty employed by a technical college district board, appointed by the state Technical College System Board, for three-year terms

Under the substitute amendment, DOA provides staff services to the board. The substitute amendment directs the board to enter into an agreement with a nonprofit corporation that has demonstrated experience in natural resource conservation and youth training to manage and administer the WCC program. The manager then engages, trains, and supervises work crews to carry out each project. The manager also identifies, reviews, and recommends proposed projects for the approval of the board. The substitute amendment requires the board to ensure that projects are equally distributed across technical college districts to the greatest extent possible, and to ensure that at least one project is located in each technical college district in each year.

To finance the operation of the WCC Board and program, the substitute amendment permits the secretary of administration to transfer any amount of money appropriated from a sum certain appropriation to an executive branch agency to the board during the period beginning on the day the substitute amendment becomes law and ending on the date of publication of the 2011–13 biennial budget act, subject to certain limitations. The secretary is prohibited from making any transfer of moneys derived from federal revenues and is also prohibited from making a transfer if the transfer would violate the state or federal constitution, state or federal law, or a requirement imposed by the federal government as a condition to receipt of aids by this state. In addition, the secretary is prohibited from transferring certain moneys appropriated to the Department of Transportation. Any proposed transfer must first be reported by the secretary to the cochairpersons of the Joint Committee on Finance and is subject to review, approval, or modification by the committee, but the committee may waive its right to review a proposed transfer.

The substitute amendment provides that a WCC project must be designed to carry out a specific goal within a defined period of time, must be focused on the conservation or enjoyment of natural resources and must have a specific, beneficial, physical effect. Projects may include new trail construction, trail rehabilitation, invasive species management, bridge and boardwalk construction, reforestation, timber stand improvement, stream bank stabilization, erosion control, rain garden installation, prairie restoration, historical site preservation, recreation site maintenance, wild land fire hazard reduction and fuels management, lake and stream restoration, boundary marking, fencing, landscaping, carpentry, and data collection for scientific research. The substitute amendment permits local governments or nonprofit corporations to submit applications to sponsor projects. A project application must identify the proposed project and the sponsor of the project and provide a detailed plan for the work on the project. In addition, the application must contain an enumeration of the number of work crews that will work on the project an affirmation as to whether the work crew members would be eligible

to participate in a youth corps program administered by the National and Community Service Board (NCSB), as well as a plan for training the work crew members, providing transportation to the project work sites, making available individualized educational opportunities for work crew members suited to the qualifications, experience, and needs of the members while they are working on the projects, for assisting work crew members in making full use of all benefits provided under such a youth corps program if the project qualifies as a youth corps program, and for visiting postsecondary institutions such as a technical college or University of Wisconsin (UW) two-year college, to familiarize the crew members with application and enrollment procedures, programs, and course offerings.

The substitute amendment provides that each work crew member on a WCC project must be between the ages of 18 and 25, and at least 50 percent of the work crew members on each project must have no postsecondary education and have a family income of not more than 200 percent of the federal poverty line on the date of their initial engagement.

The substitute amendment provides that, if the board determines that an application is an appropriate WCC project and that work crew members would be eligible under the program, the manager must jointly submit the application with the sponsor to NCSB for funding. If funding is provided by NCSB, the manager must use the funding to assist the sponsor in training the work crews.

The substitute amendment requires each sponsor of a WCC project to do both of the following: upon completion of the project, erect a permanent plaque at each work site identifying the site as a WCC project; and submit a report to the board identifying the number of work crew members who enrolled at a technical college, a UW college, or another postsecondary institution upon completion of the project and their status on the first anniversary of completion of the project.

The substitute amendment exempts services performed by WCC work crews from compliance with requirements for state and local public works projects to adhere to current prevailing wage scales. The substitute amendment permits the board to retain its manager and other state agencies to engage a WCC crew on a project without complying with state procurement laws, including requirements for public notice to and competitive solicitation of contractors and limitations on the circumstances when contractual services may be obtained.

Finally, the substitute amendment requires the board to submit an annual report to the legislature identifying the projects completed in each year or that are in the process of completion as of the end of that year.


