## Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill directs the Department of Administration (DOA), in conjunction with the Department of Public Instruction (DPI) and the Legislative Fiscal Bureau (LFB), to certify an annual estimate of the amount necessary under s. 20.255(2)(ac) to ensure that the sum of state school aids and the school levy tax credit equals varying percentages specified in the bill.

The fiscal impact on DOA would be minimal and the work can be absorbed within current resources.
