Hello,

I'm not sure if the following request falls under "legislature" or "State Finance" so I am sending this request to both of you:

Rep. Vos would like to draft a bill that forms a commission to be known as the Waste, Fraud, Abuse, and Oversight Commission with the same makeup as the building commission - 4 from senate, 4 from assembly (evenly split by party), the governor and one appointed public member. Advisory members should come from the DOA Budget Office.

Direct the commission to examine all areas of state government for waste, fraud and abuse. Direct the committee to make recommendations containing approximate dollar amounts where savings could be achieved. Recommendations should be presented to the Joint Committee on Finance by March of the 2011.

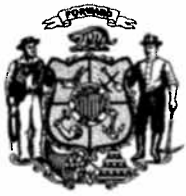
Specify that all savings achieved must be deposited in the Governor's Opportunity Fund (LRB 4072 - Drafter Chris Sundberg).

This bill creates a committee to be known as the Waste, Fraud, Abuse, and Oversight Commission, consisting of the governor; two majority party senators; two minority party senators; two majority party representatives to the assembly; two minority party representatives to the assembly; and a public member appointed by the governor. The commission must examine all areas of state government and state programs for evidence of waste, fraud, and abuse. No later than March 1, 2011, the commission must submit a report of its findings and recommendations to the cochairpersons of the Joint Committee on Finance. The report must specify the amount of savings to the state that would occur if the recommendations contained in the report were implemented. The commission ceases to exist when it has submitted the report or on March 1, 2011, whichever is sooner.

The bill further provides that, in budget deliberations for the 2011-13 fiscal biennium, the Joint Committee on Finance must consider the recommendations of the commission contained in the report.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:
