WHEREAS, we must work to increase public awareness about scoliosis, which is an abnormal curvature of the spine that affects an estimated six million people in the United States; and

WHEREAS, the effects of scoliosis, which can include prolonged periods of pain; limited activity and mobility; and reduced respiratory function can have a profound impact on a person's quality of life; and
