1 **Relating to:** Proclaiming May 2, 2009, as Pediatric Stroke Awareness Day.

Whereas, a stroke, also known as a "cerebrovascular accident," is an acute neurologic injury that occurs when the blood supply to a part of the brain is interrupted by a clot in the artery or a burst of the artery; and

Whereas, a stroke is a medical emergency that can cause permanent neurologic damage or even death if not promptly diagnosed and treated; and

Whereas, the risk of stroke in children is greatest in the first year of life, particularly in the first month of life when neonatal stroke occurs in about one of every 4,000 live births; and

Whereas, a baby can have a stroke before birth; and

Whereas, nearly six out of every 100,000 children have a stroke each year; and

Whereas, stroke is among the top ten causes of death for children in the United

13 States; and

Whereas, up to 25 percent of all children who experience a stroke die as a result;

4	one year is the highest out of all age groups; and

6	long-term neurological disabilities, including hemiplegia, which is paralysis of one
7	side of the body; seizures; speech and vision problems; and learning difficulties; and
8	Whereas, those disabilities may require lifelong physical, occupational, and
9	speech therapies, and surgeries; and
.0	Whereas, the permanent health concerns and treatments resulting from
1	strokes that occur during childhood and young adulthood have a considerable impact
.2	on children, families, and society; and
.3	Whereas, very little is known about the cause, treatment, and prevention of
4	pediatric stroke; and
5	Whereas, medical research is the only means by which the citizens of the United
.6	States can identify and develop effective treatment and prevention strategies for
7	childhood stroke; and
8	Whereas, early diagnosis and treatment of pediatric stroke greatly improves
9	the chances that the affected child will recover and not experience a recurrence; now,
