



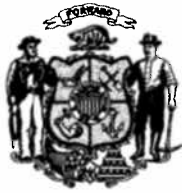

In 2007, Wisconsin pork producers marketed 940,000 hogs. Wisconsin's pork industry supports 5,000 jobs and means \$200 million to our state's economy.

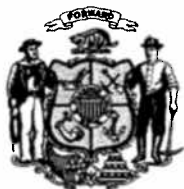
