





Whereas, Velma Bell met Harry Lemuel Hamilton in North Carolina in 1931, and they married in 1934, moved to Madison, Wisconsin, in 1942, and together raised three children; and

Whereas, Velma Hamilton served her communities as an educator in numerous positions, first as an assistant professor at Bennett College in Gastonia, North Carolina, later as the first African American teacher at Madison Vocational School
