**Relating to:** recognizing February 2010 as American Heart Month.

Whereas, cardiovascular disease is the nation's leading cause of death with direct and indirect costs estimated to be \$475.3 billion in 2009; and

Whereas, cardiovascular disease accounts for over 35 percent of all deaths nationwide; and

Whereas, nearly 2,400 Americans die of cardiovascular disease each day, an average of one death every 37 seconds; and

Whereas, an estimated 785,000 people in the United States will have a new coronary attack, an estimated 470,000 people nationwide will have a recurrent attack, and an additional 195,000 "silent" coronary attacks will go undiagnosed this year; and

Whereas, cardiovascular disease accounts for over 32 percent of all deaths in Wisconsin; and

Whereas, cardiovascular disease is the cause of death for nearly 15,000 Wisconsinites each year; and

Whereas, cardiovascular disease accounts for nearly 90,000 hospitalizations in Wisconsin each year; and

Whereas, the research is clear that there are tools available to increase survival rates from cardiovascular disease; and

Whereas, efforts of the American Heart Association encourage citizens to help save lives by calling 9-1-1 if symptoms occur, by becoming trained in CPR, and by encouraging comprehensive automated external defibrillator (AED) programs in their communities; and
