Whereas, cardiovascular disease is the nation's leading cause of death with direct and indirect costs estimated to be \$475.3 billion in 2009; and

Whereas, cardiovascular disease accounts for over 35 percent of all deaths nationwide; and Whereas, nearly 2,400 Americans die of cardiovascular disease each day, an average of one death every 37 seconds; and

Whereas, an estimated 785,000 people in the United States will have a new coronary attack, an estimated 470,000 people nationwide will have a recurrent attack, and an additional 195,000 "silent" coronary attacks will go undiagnosed this year; and

Whereas, cardiovascular disease accounts for over 32 percent of all deaths in Wisconsin; and Whereas, cardiovascular disease is the cause of death for nearly 15,000 Wisconsinites each year; and

Whereas, cardiovascular disease accounts for nearly 90,000 hospitalizations in Wisconsin each year; and

Whereas, the research is clear that there are tools available to increase survival rates from cardiovascular disease; and

Whereas, efforts of the American Heart Association encourage citizens to help save lives by calling 9–1–1 if symptoms occur, by becoming trained in CPR, and by encouraging comprehensive automated external defibrillator (AED) programs in their communities; and
