


Intent: To provide, upon passage of the Budget Adjustment Bill, a total of \$2.63 million from the Wisconsin Development fund for Green Job and Infrastructure

Training/Retraining, and to increase the total funding for the Development Fund to offset these grants by \$2.63 million GPR one-time funding. Direct Commerce to award \$2.63 million from the Wisconsin Development Fund to the following groups, in the following amounts. Also direct Commerce to enter into agreements with these groups to specify the uses for the grant proceeds and reporting and auditing requirements.

- \$1.0 million for expansion of Wisconsin Regional Training Partnership (WRTP)/BIG STEP
- \$1.63 million for green job training and retraining for specific building trades, as follows:
  - \$325,000 to Painters and Allied Trades, District Council 7
    - Provide \$150,000 to train workers on Leadership in Energy and Efficiency Design (LEED) certification; workers would qualify to bid on LEED projects built with green building materials.
    - Provide \$175,000 to certify instructors in NACE and SSPC standards; workers would be trained on industrial practices and remediation services such as lead paint abatement on bridges and overpasses.

FY 2008-09

- \$247,000 to WI State Council of Carpenters
  - Provide \$175,000 to train workers on windmill and other alternative energy installation.
  - Provide \$72,000 to train workers on sustainable green building practices.
- \$248,000 to WI Pipe Trades Association, Local 75 to build a 'green' trailer that will be used for mobile worker training across the state. Workers would receive training on new building codes, environmentally sound construction practices, and help develop new initiatives for green construction.
- \$265,000 to WI Laborers District Council
- \$275,000 to WI Operating Engineers to train workers on geothermal technologies.
- \$270,000 to International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers
  - Provide a \$210,000 grant for equipment to create 3 labs in Wisconsin to train workers on installation of solar electricity.
  - Provide \$60,000 for instruction start-up cost for these 3 labs.

## OPERATING ENGINEERS LOCAL 139 GREEN ENERGY TRAINING PROGRAM

Two of the most promising means to help the state achieve energy independence are wind energy and geothermal energy. Both have been around for some time and both employ techniques that are not totally new.

However, what is different is that wind energy turbines are at a height that most contractors have not generally gone and thus do not have employees trained to do that.

Likewise, tapping geothermal energy requires contractors to drill to a depth that is beyond what they have trained employees to do.

Both of these processes are done with the type of equipment that members of Operating Engineers Local 139 generally operate.

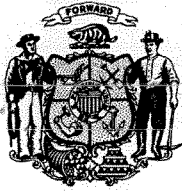
### PROPOSAL

Operating Engineers Local 139 operate a modern training facility in Coloma, Wisconsin. The training school has been in operation since 1972. Annually the school trains up to 5,000 of its members.

Local 139 proposes to establish as a part of its curriculum for apprentices a class in "Operating Cranes to Construct Wind Energy Farms" and a separate class in "Operating Earth Drilling Equipment to Tap Into Geothermal Energy"

Funds will be used specifically to: develop a curriculum, develop curriculum materials, purchase necessary equipment (new simulator), train an instructor(s), teach up to 100 apprentices per year for the next two years. Following the 2 year period, Local 139 plans to continue to keep these two courses integrated into its Apprentice Program.

**ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT**

This bill provides a total of \$2,630,000 in grant moneys from the appropriation that funds the Wisconsin Development Fund to certain organizations in the building trades to provide job training and retraining programs, including training in green building and the installation of alternative energy systems. The following organizations receive grant funds under this bill: 1) the Wisconsin Regional Training Partnership Building Industry Group Skilled Trades Employment Program; 2) Painters and Allied Trades, District Council 7; 3) Wisconsin State Council of Carpenters; 4) Wisconsin Pipe Trades Association, Local 75; 5) Wisconsin Laborers District Council; 6) Wisconsin Operating Engineers; and 7) International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers. As a condition of receiving the grant moneys, each organization must enter into a contract with the Department of Commerce that specifies permissible uses of the grant moneys and that requires the organization to comply with certain reporting and accountability measures established by Commerce. The bill increases the appropriation to the Wisconsin Development Fund for fiscal year 2008-09 by \$2,630,000.



**ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT**

This bill provides a total of \$2,630,000 in grant moneys from the appropriation that funds the Wisconsin Development Fund to certain organizations in the building trades to provide job training and retraining programs, including training in green building and the installation of alternative energy systems. The following organizations receive grant funds under this bill: 1) the Wisconsin Regional Training Partnership/Building Industry Group Skilled Trades Employment Program; 2) Painters and Allied Trades, District Council 7; 3) Wisconsin State Council of Carpenters; 4) Wisconsin Pipe Trades Association, Local 75; 5) Wisconsin Laborers' District Council; 6) Wisconsin Operating Engineers; and 7) International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers. As a condition of receiving the grant moneys, each organization must enter into a contract with the Department of Commerce (Commerce) that specifies permissible uses of the grant moneys and that requires the organization to comply with certain reporting and accountability measures established by Commerce. The bill increases the appropriation to the Wisconsin Development Fund for fiscal year 2008-09 by \$2,630,000.

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***The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:***

1           **SECTION 1.** 20.143 (1) (c) of the statutes is amended to read:
